


I just had the roof on my bathroom in the rectory fixed ③. There was a big leak. I hope this repair will last—*a lifetime.*

CELEBRATING THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

Have you ever sat in front a great work of art hanging on a wall in an art gallery and felt yourself being drawn into the painting? You know - wondering what's beyond the garden gate or wonder what the man in the painting was thinking about? Did you not find answers to your questions after a period of quiet reflection? Yes, a picture is worth a thousand words, and this week I am asking you to become better acquainted with St. Joseph – to "converse" with St. Joseph - through sacred art and iconology. To begin, select a picture of a painting of St. Joseph that appeals to you. If you do not have one, the Diocese of Charlotte has twelve paintings/icons available for reflection on the website:

www.yearofstjospeh.org/devotions/sacred-artwork.

Enlarge the picture, find a quiet place in which to reflect, and say a short prayer. Then ask your self, what is the painting about and what is the setting? Who or what is in the painting? Slowly begin to focus on details in the painting as a whole, and on St. Joseph in particular; details such as lighting, postures, expressions, etc. Allow the painting's scene to "come alive" in your imagination. Take time to really get to know St. Joseph *personally*. What is he thinking? What is he feeling? Don't be shy – "converse" with St. Joseph, ask him questions, share your thoughts with him and most importantly, allow St. Joseph to "speak" to you. End your reflection by thanking St. Joseph for this special time together. End your reflection with a prayer, perhaps the Litany of St. Joseph.

This year, the children spent much more time outside. It soon became clear that our fields needed a facelift! In order to reintroduce softball and cross country and add soccer, we needed to clear the diseased and dead trees and underbrush and regrade the fields. The children, with the help of the faculty and parents organized our first Jump-a-thon with the Knights of Columbus! We need \$60,000 to complete the entire project. We hoped to raise \$10,000 with the Jump-a-thon. But as usual, our students never cease to amaze us. With the support and generosity of our Parishioners, friends and families, the children raised \$25,000, enough for the first phase!

Through the goodness of our Alumni, the Pillari Brothers Construction Corp. will start the second phase. Using the latest drone technology, they are providing the topographic study to create the plan for grading the fields. We still need your help! We are working with another vendor to complete the fields.

Obviously, we need additional funds (\$35,000) to complete the field. We are looking for masons to build our dugouts. The Blessed Mother Shrine is also getting a facelift. The diseased trees and deadly vines were removed. Now, we need to plant new trees to honor the Blessed Mother. Please let us know if you can help us or if you know of anyone that we can ask to help us with the next phase.

For now, we are excited that the field is ready for Our Parish Picnic on Sunday, September 26, 2021. Make sure you join us to reunite our parish after the restraints of the past year and of course to **enjoy the view**!
