

My dear Parish Family,

We often hear the saying: The truth hurts.

As Christians we must always speak the truth. Although at times, speaking the truth, can be challenging. How many times have we experienced that our friends didn't believe us or hated us because they didn't like what they heard even if it was the truth. It even seems the world prefers to hear lies than truth as long as they're pleasing to our ears and won't hurt us.



This weekend, the readings invite us to live for the truth and if necessary, die for the truth. In the first reading we heard, Jeremiah, as a prophet, was speaking the truth.
