





Giving thanks for God's blessings

Did you know that this August marks the 140th anniversary of the Diocese of Trenton? In 1881, Pope Leo XIII established the Diocese of Trenton to serve the Catholics of the southern part of New Jersey and named Father Michael J. O'Farrell of New York as its first bishop. At the time, the Diocese had 68 churches, 23 parochial schools and 51 priests spread out across Burlington, Mercer, Monmouth and Ocean Counties, as well as all of the territory that is now part of the Dioceses of Camden and Metuchen. 



<u>H</u>ere's <u>One Positive Encouragement</u>

How often do we wish we had taken a stand for or against what someone was saying, a situation we were in, or something about to happen to us or someone else and did nothing? Were we happy and satisfied with our action or inaction, more importantly, do you think God was pleased with our decision? Every day our actions or lack of them have an effect and repercussions on both ourselves and others, some of which we will never see or realize, while others will have immediate results. Do we realize that a non-action on our part in most cases is an automatic favorable action for something? Example: we do not like who is running for public office, so we do not vote. This non-vote is saying both candidates are okay with us, when in fact we do not like either one. Another example: your town has a lot of deer, which is affecting traffic, people and gardens. The town council is having a meeting about this situation for people to voice their opinions. You have already hit a deer with your car, you do not attend to voice your opinion, therefore, by default you are acknowledging that there isn't a deer problem. If people before us did not voice their opinion and say what they felt, we would still be governed by monarchies and living in a feudal society. Our Mass would still be said in Latin, not the native language of the people attending so they could more freely participate in the mass. What I am saying is that we have a basic obligation to ourselves, our society, our church and to each other. To participate in life, we need to use our experiences, our free will and our love for God in making decisions and not be afraid of the consequences. How many times can we say we stood up for God, our religion and something we strongly believed in? Did we ever risk family, friends or our job for our beliefs? Are we afraid of people thinking that we are wrong or stupid, or that they may not want to be associated with us because of what we say and do? We have no right to intentionally hurt anyone, however, we do have as much right to our actions and beliefs as others have to theirs. We have an obligation to ourselves, and others to not allow our thoughts and beliefs to be cancelled. I HOPE we have the stamina and fortitude to prevail in our thoughts and beliefs knowing that God is with us.
