### A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

This week we will traditionally observe the memorial of Saint Nicolas on December 6th. St. Nicolas was a Bishop of Myra in Asia Minor who lived in the fourth century. He was known for his great charity for the poor and especially children from poor families. St. Nicolas did not want the people to know about his charitable giving and therefore he would go out in the middle of the night to those homes that he knew were struggling to support their own families. Nicolas would place coins inside the shoes of the children who left them in front of the doors of their homes. The news about these secret donations became known among the people and therefore the people, in their curiosity, decided to find out who this generous donor was. They waited until nightfall and were watching for this unknown individual. Nicolas although walking through the streets discreetly was spotted by the curious group, who then pursue him until they reached the home in which St. Nicolas resided. Then they realized that it was their bishop who was the generous helper. The knowledge about this discovery became known to the public. St. Nicolas however did not stop his charitable work and even inspired others to show greater Christian charity to the poor and the needy. In gratitude to this holy bishop the people buried him in a casket made from pure silver. The place where the relics or holy remains are in today's country of Turkey. So, if you ever have plans to visit that country make sure you plan to make a visit to the tomb of this great saint.

That is why St. Nicolas is such a great example to our Catholic faith, in showing the love for the poor. Because of the events from St. Nicolas' life the tradition developed among the Catholics to set up shoes and place inside them different gifts. This is the reason the practice of setting up stockings for Christmas has become an element and symbol of celebrating Christmas Holidays. It is therefore important that we continue to uphold these traditions and customs of Christmas Holidays, because they enable us to practice our Catholic Faith in a very real and tangible way. It is those small traditions that we pass down from generation to generation that help us to cultivate Christian culture.

It is also important to note that St. Nicolas was a great defender of the purity of the faith. St. Nicolas was one of the faithful bishops who attended the Ecumenical Council of Nicaea in 325. The reason I call him 'faithful' it is because a great majority of the bishops at that time fell into heresy of Arianism, which denied the divinity of Christ. During the Council meeting St. Nicolas hearing the heretical opinions of Arius who was present at the council lost his temper and walked over to Arius and slapped him across the face. This was a great shock to other bishops who were present. They knew St. Nicolas as a kind and humble man, so they were caught a little bit by surprise. However, we must know that during the council the tensions were extremely high and disputes on the issues of faith were of no small concern. Of course, St. Nicolas' defense of the faith did not take place only at the council, but constantly throughout his episcopal ministry in teaching authentic faith and correcting errors. Because we must be aware that concern for right faith and correcting those who fall into erroneous belief is also an act of love and mercy. An important fact that I would like to share with you is that this year 2025 we are going to celebrate the 1700-year anniversary of that important council. I hope that throughout this year we will be able to celebrate a double dose of hope and joy in our Catholic Faith, because on one hand we will have a celebration of Holy Jubilee Year and at the same time anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. I am looking forward with great enthusiasm to the celebration of these two important events with the Church and you, my dear parish family.

St. Nicolas, pray for us! Our Lady of Hope, pray for us!


#### **RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)**
