A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

This coming week, December 12th, we will celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. This feast is not just relevant to the people of Mexico, but to all of America's continents. When in Europe in the 1520's the protestant revolt against the Catholic Church was on its way, on this side of the Atlantic the missionaries worked hard to evangelize the people of the new world. Although, the missionaries worked with much dedication, yet their efforts had a small response on the part of the native people of these lands. One of the missionaries, however, had a vision in which he saw a great multitude of people coming to be Baptized. Of course, he was skeptical about his vision since he did not know what could cause such an event to take place. Although, the Spaniards stopped the human sacrifices offered to pagan gods of Aztec people, yet the natives continued in their believes and worship of these false deities. On December 9th, 1531, a native convert to Christianity Juan Diego was on his way from his village to Mexico City to attend the daily Mass. While he was passing over the hill called Tepeyac, he encountered the sight of a beautiful lady, radiating with light, who was dressed like an Azteca princess. She addressed Juan Diego with endearing words, calling him my little Juanito. She told him that she is the virgin Mary, Mother of the true God, through whom all things live. She asked Juan to go to the bishop in Mexico City and ask him to build a chapel upon this hill to the honor of the Holy Virgin. Juan was a humble man and he set out to deliver the message as this lady requested of him. He waited a long time to finally be able to speak with the bishop, however the bishop did not believe him. He returned to the lady and asked her to send someone else. However, the lady asked him to go again, and he did go the next day. Bishop responded to Juan's message that he needs a proof to know whether this request is authentic, to believe him. Juan Diego returned home and found his uncle that lived with him to be not well. He cared for his uncle as best as he could. His uncle was not getting better so Juan on the morning of December 12th, decided to go to the Mexico City to get a priest to give his uncle last rites. Juan Diego did not want to be detained by the lady on the hill, so he decided to go around the hill instead. While passing the hill on the side, the lady appeared to him who said to him with sweet voice: "My little Juanito, am I not your mother who cares for you?" She told him that his uncle should be well by now and that he should not be anxious about him. She asked Juan Diego to go to the top of the hill and bring the flowers to her that are growing there. It was a winter and when Juan Diego got to the top of the hill he noticed in the snow beautiful Castilian roses, which only grow in Spain. He gathered them into his apron called tilma and he brought them to the lady, who arrange them in his apron and told him to bring them to the bishop and that this will be a sign to him, that Juan Diego's message is true and authentic. Juan went down to the bishop's place, and he would not let anyone see what he carried in his apron. He asked to see the bishop. He was led into the large room, where the bishop was present along with other people in his company. Juan Diego said to the bishop that he brought him the proof that the bishop asked for. As Juan Diego opened the apron and the roses felt down, the bishop and the people facing Juan beheld an image that appeared on his apron of the lady radiant with the sun. Juan did not immediately realize what happened and only after he was asked to remove the apron that he noticed it had an image of the lady that appeared to him at the hill of Tepeyac. The bishop brought the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe to his chapel and began preparation to build a chapel on the top of Tepeyac hill. The news of this event began to spread and especially among the natives, who began to come in multitudes and requesting to be Baptized. Due to this great miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe, thousands of native people converted to Christianity. There were so many people that wanted to be Baptized that the missionaries could barely keep up. Our Lady of Guadalupe brought the native and Spanish settlers together as one people. The Devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe, helped the Mexican Catholics endure persecution by Communists and Free Masons in the twentieth century. Also, it helped them to preserve the Christian faith, which during that period, the freedom to publicly exercise faith was outlawed. If you are interested in the hidden messages and miraculous stories involving the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe, I will share it with you the following Sunday, so stay tuned.




