

A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

Advent is ending and a joyful season of Christmas begins. I wanted to share with you about this amazing true story that took place in northern town of Italy in Bra, Piedmont. On the evening December 29th, 1336, a young wife named Egidia Mathis was returning home when she spotted two French soldiers, mercenaries hiding behind the bushes. She was pregnant with child and from the looks of these men she sensed that she was in danger of being taking advantage by them. Since she was in the advanced stage of her pregnancy, she knew that she would not be able to escape and run away. She went over to a statue of Mary on the pillar that was nearby and kneeling she pleaded with Our Blessed Mother for help. As those two men approached this young pregnant woman all the sudden a flash of light came from the statue which frightened those two soldiers and made them runaway. The young woman beheld a vision of our Blessed Mother, who told her that everything is going to be well and that she does not need to be afraid anymore and all will be well with her child as well. Because the young woman suffered emotional distress of the situation, she gave birth to her healthy first child in that very moment. After delivery, she shared with the people of the town what took place and therefore the people went to the location where she said she saw our Blessed Mother. When people got to the place, they saw the statue of Mary on the pillar, and to their amazement they noticed that the leafless blackthorn bushes which were covered in ice and grew in the place of the apparition were blooming with thousands of little flowers. Ever since that event the bushes in that location continue to bloom every year from December 25th to January 15th. The only time that the flowers did not bloom was in 1914 and 1939 when two World Wars began. The church next to the location of this miraculous site and apparition is called Our Lady of the Flowers. Due to the remarkable blooming of those blackthorn bushes, the scientists from nearby University tried to investigate this phenomenon. They used the same type of blackthorn bushes and they tried to plant them in the same soil that was found in place of apparition. However, their efforts proved useless, and they concluded that they cannot explain the reasons why in middle of winter those bushes bloom while all the rest of the bushes that are of the same species, same type of plant do not. I have not been to Italy yet, but I would like to visit this site. I hope that this true story and ongoing evidence of the blooming flowers at that place of Mary's apparition will help you to grow in love with our Blessed Mother. Whenever difficulty or crisis appears in your life try to remember what Mary did and how she came to the rescue of her child that turned to her for help. Let us confide our lives and families in her motherly care and we will not be disappointed with her unfailing help. Mary too in her life had to face many difficulties like traveling long journey to Bethlehem while she was in later part of pregnancy with Jesus. She could not even enjoy the moment of the birth of Christ, and she had to flee with Joseph to Egypt, because king Herod sent army to Bethlehem to kill her baby son. Mary is sinless and holy, but she did face real life difficulties like us. This knowledge should give us consolation that she understands what we are going through, and she knows our fears, our worries, our concerns. She loves us so deeply because we are her children. Like every loving mother, she is there when their children are going through difficult times to support them and encourage them to trust God and not to give up hope. Our Lady of Flowers, pray for us! Our Lady of Hope, Pray for us!

My dear parish family, I wish you all a Blessed and Joyful Christmas, and may the coming of Christ child fill your hearts with peace and grace. Merry Christmas!!!

Las Posadas 2023

The roots of *Las Posadas* stretch deeply into Latin culture. It originated in Spain, but it's been a yearly celebration throughout Mexico for over 400 years. The tradition commemorates Mary and Joseph's difficult journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem in search of a warm place to stay the night. (*Posadas* is Spanish for "lodgings" or "accommodations. ")

Mary and Joseph faced the elements of the journey —and indifferent innkeepers that night. Las Posadas is the story of Christmas: It's about pilgrims and a pilgrimage. The story of Christ's birth has been told and retold so many times it could have lost its luster generations ago. But it hasn't—not even close. If anything, in this world of war, famine and natural disasters, holding on to something as simple and as singularly important as the Nativity story is a necessity to our faith.

Thank you to the eighth grade students and the entire student body for once again, telling us the story of Las Posadas reminding us that in very humble surroundings, the Son of God came to us, to bring peace.
