A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

We begin the month of December, which is dedicated to the Immaculate Conception of Blessed Virgin Mary. While we are busy getting ready for Christmas Holidays, we should take time to prepare ourselves interiorly. That is why the four weeks prior to Christmas are dedicated as a time of penance and prayer. The Advent season is short yet when spent well, in the right spirit and disposition of heart can bring a good fruit in our spiritual life. During this season we hear about the joyful expectation of the coming of Christ. God was preparing for the coming of his Son for a long time. The theme of waiting and preparing are emphasized. While there are many events and historical details that led to realization of God's plan, yet there where many events or happenings that were also hidden and full of mystery. One of those great mysteries is the Immaculate Conception of Blessed Virgin Mary. Mary was preordained by God to become the mother of the Son of God. She out of all the woman in human history was given this great privilege and favor. We could just stop here and marvel at this great honor that Mary received. Yet God in his great wisdom and power sought to make Mary not just a vessel for his son, but truly a mother that would be perfect in everyway and worthy of such election. While sometimes Catholics may be confused about whose conception we are talking about, it is important to remember that Immaculate conception refers to the mystery of Mary being conceived in the womb of her mother St. Ann. The mystery of the conception of Jesus in Mary's womb we celebrate on March 25th, which is the Solemnity of the Annunciation. Because as soon as Mary said her fiat, YES, to the Archangel's message, she conceived Christ in her womb. From the Solemnity of Annunciation is exactly 9 months to Christmas Day. Whereas the Solemnity of Immaculate Conception of Mary on December 8th is celebrated exactly 9 months prior to September 8th when we celebrate Mary's birthday. I hope this clarifies the confusion. Although Christmas is an important event in our Christian celebration of our Salvation, yet Mary's Immaculate Conception only further highlights the significance of Christ coming, his birth, his work of redemption. Mary received God's favor and was given the grace of Christ's redemption in the very moment of her conception. Apart from Mary, each one of us have been born with original sin and only later at our baptism that we received the grace of Christ's redemption. So, we may ask what is a big deal about the timing of receiving God's grace? The difference lies in the fact that because we were born with original sin, we also in effect suffer the consequences of original sin that are: suffering and death, darkened intellect, weakened will and concupiscence. Because Mary, by God's favor, was not conceived with original sin, she also was preserved from its effects. By the virtue of being preserved from original sin, Mary was always from the moment of her conception in fullness of grace. This was revealed to her and to us through the Archangel Gabriel greeting during the Annunciation, "Hail, full of grace". We are grateful to Mary for sharing with us the details of that special visit by Archangel Gabriel otherwise we may have only known about this great mystery in heaven. Knowing what God accomplished through Mary fill us with great hope and joy and helps us to receive new fervor in striving for greater holiness and virtue in our lives. Mary is a shining star of hope for us who still walk this life and must bear the burden of sin. She is our refuge and strength when we face our weak nature, because she reminds us that with the help of God's grace we can be changed, our nature can change, and our lives can change all for the better. Therefore, let us turn to Mary and ask our Holy Mother to obtain for us the grace of greater purity, greater holiness, and virtue. She is pure for she is the Immaculate Conception, and with the help of her prayers, she can obtain for us from her Son the grace that we may be preserved from falling into sin and never to offend Holy God again. Let us pray to our beloved mother with hearts full of trust and confidence "O Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to the."
