

A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

On the last Sunday of the year and Second Sunday of Christmas we celebrate the feast of Holy Family. The reason this family was holy because Jesus Christ the Son of God was in its center. When our families keep God in their center then our families will also become holy. We need to remember that we were called to the relationship with God the Father, and God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We were called to a relationship that is a communion of love. We too are called to love one another, and especially in our relationship with our immediate family members and the family of the Catholic Church. The Holy Family was a family that desired to love goodness, justice, humility, and all the rest of the virtues. If our families will desire to grow in virtue and walk in right relationship with God, then we too will become a holy family. The Holy Family was always concern with doing the will of God, to do all that would please Him, to surrender their own plans and to serve God in carrying out His plan. This is not an easy task to do for our families, because this requires a great faith and trust in God's Divine Providence. The lessons of Christmas are particularly helpful in living our lives with faith and trust in God's Divine Providence. Mary and Joseph did not have an easy time raising their son, even though they lived good and virtuous lives. Sometimes we are doing all the good that we can, yet life brings its own challenges and difficulties. We should not be disheartened that they come, but rather use them as means to grow in greater faith and trust in God's providential care. It is then, especially, that we need to believe and surrender with trust to God, knowing that He will help us to go through it and He will provide for us a good resolution in His own time. To help our families to grow in faith and trust in God's Divine Providence, I would recommend the devotion to the Infant Jesus of Prague. This devotion began some time in the 16th century when the figure of the infant Jesus was brought from Spain to Bohemia and was venerated by the aristocratic family from that territory. When the protestant king of Sweden invaded the those lands the figure end up laying along side with the rubles of the destroyed churches. The Carmelites that came to settle in Prague found this figure of the infant Jesus, which was missing hands. One Carmelite brother while praying heard the voice coming from the figure: "repair my hands," and "the more you honor me, the more I will bless you." The brother did what he was asked. He repaired the hands of the statue of the Infant Jesus. Afterwards the Carmelite brothers began great devotions, prayers, and supplications in honor of the Divine Infant Jesus. As the time went on their poor monastery began to receive great support from different strangers so that they were able to repair the monastery and had little concern for their basic needs to run the monastic life. Once again, the land of Prague went back to the protestant control and the Carmelite monks had to leave the monastery. After some time when another catholic king reclaimed these lands, the Carmelite monks returned to their monastery. However, this time they paid little attention to the statue of the infant Jesus, which they left behind when they had to abandon the monastery previously. They found themselves struggling to support their monastic life. The brother who first heard the voice and repaired the statues hands realized that the monks fell away from their devotion to the Divine Infant Jesus. As soon as the brothers began a new their devotion to the Infant Jesus, it was not long after that their lives began to improve, and they began to receive the support for their basic necessities to be able to live a monastic life in peace once again. This background for the origin of the Infant Jesus of Prague can help us to appreciate this devotion and power of God's care to provide for our necessities so that we may be able to have tranquility in carrying out our devotion and dedication to Him. We are fortunate to have the statues of the Infant Jesus of Prague at both Churches. It is my hope that we can rekindle this devotion in our parish, so that the more we will honor Infant Jesus, the more blessings we will receive for our parish and our families. Infant Jesus of Prague, we Love you and we Adore you and we Praise you, we place all our trust in your loving care!

Happy New Year to you all my Parish Family! May this new year 2024 bring us greater faith, hope and love. May with the help of God's grace we will be able to reach new heights in our spiritual life and our parish will be blessed with new zeal and fervor to win more souls for Christ. God Bless You!!!

Please register as a parishioner

Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think they automatically are registered just by attending Mass regularly in a particular parish but it requires a form to be submitted to the parish office with copies of sacrament records. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes such as, scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility form if requirements are met, a gualification letter from the pastor and receiving a year end donation tax statement. Weekly collection envelopes are used to track attendance at Mass. Registration in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
