# A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

The entire month of December is dedicated to the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Apart from the solemn celebration of the Immaculate Conception on December 8th, which fell on Sunday this year and therefore it was moved to the next day, there are other Marian celebrations during this month. On December 10th we will celebrate Mary under the title of Our Lady of Loreto. This commemoration celebrates Mary as the one who housed in herself, but also in her dwelling Jesus, the Son of God. Loreto is a city in Italy where we will find the house in which in accordance with the tradition the Holy Family lived in. This house is not large, but it is believed that it was carried to this place by the angels. The house traveled miraculously from the Holy Land, and it arrived in the city of Loreto on December 10, 1294. The basilica in the city of Loretto contains this little house. It is believed that litany to our Blessed Mother was composed there and therefore it is known as litany of Loreto. Many miracles and favors devout Christians have received by praying this litany to our Blessed Mother throughout the centuries or at least since 1598 when it was officially presented to the pope. I would encourage everyone to discover and use this beautiful prayer, especially now in the season of Advent so that Mary may lead us in preparation for the celebration of our Lord's birth.

Another feast of our Blessed Mother is celebrated on December 12th under the title of Our Lady of Guadalupe. About which I shared with you last year. It involved the apparition of our Lady to St. Juan Diego in Mexico and the miracles imprint of Mary's image on his tilma which was an apron that St. Juan Diego wore. Throughout this year we were encouraged to participate in the Novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe. I have posted the text of this novena on our parish website along with the video message from Cardinal Burke. If you have not joined in praying this novena you may still join even now and pray until December 12th. This initiative was made by the Cardinal so that we may not lose hope in these confusing and dark times. It is in the times of struggle and difficulty in the world and in the church that we can always rely on the powerful assistance from our Blessed Mother. She has many times intervened throughout history and have come to the help of the Christians to provide us with encouragement and guidance. Even now our Blessed Mother is our refuge and help and we can confidently entrust ourselves to her and listen to her motherly voice. Mary always urges us to pray as much as we can and with great fervor and faith.

It is prayer that is seemingly insignificant that makes a profound impact on the world. Unfortunately, in the business of our life many times we can put aside prayer as something that can wait and prioritize other activities as more important to the wellbeing of our life and the good of our family and prosperous future. However, the benefits of prayer cannot be underestimated if we are aware of the true power of prayer. Not only can we obtain good results or outcomes for this life, but it will be of even greater benefit for our eternal life. It is important to remember, that "if we pray little, we will obtain little" God is always prepared to bestow on us great gifts and blessings if we are seeking to receive them from him. If we ask from God just a little, then why we should expect to receive more. God is always fair and just with us and gives us in proportion to our desire to receive. Therefore, let us renew our efforts to pray, the Litany to our Blessed Mother, the Novena and of course the rosary. May this season of Advent be a time of great prayer so that it may help us to better prepare ourselves for the celebration of the birth of our Lord.

Our Lady of Loreto, pray for us! Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us! Our Lady of Hope, pray for us!
