A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday the 11th of February is World Marriage Day. During this weekend we want to highlight the great value of marriage and its essential element to the formation of family and prosperity of society. Marriage was instituted by God from the moment of creation of human beings. The first marriage of Adam and Eve was the beginning of human family and the beginning of human history. The marriage of Adam and Eve started in harmony with God and all of creation, but this harmony did not last because of the Devil's envy. Although Adam and Eve fell into sin, the original sin, the institution of marriage did not end, but now was faced with new challenges. Christ by raising our nature from sin into grace, has also raised the marriage into a sacrament. This natural union between man and woman, between husband and wife, was given a new life and a new blessing. The sacramental marriage is drawn into Christ who sanctifies it and offers it a new dimension. Because the married couple receive the life of Christ, God gives them a mean to use this natural vocation for growth in virtue and holiness of life, and for their union to serve as a witness to the love of God, and a way to bring Christ into the world. We cannot forget that marriage's natural end is to bring forth life, to bear children. However, the gift of grace to married couples is now also directed to helping them raise their children so that they may become saints and obtain eternal life of heaven. In this task sacramental marriage established for this life, has also supernatural end. We want to pray particularly this Sunday for all the couples who continue in their fidelity and love to each other, despite the many challenges and difficulties they must face in our trying times. We want to pray that the Lord strengthen them in their commitment to each other, but also to God who brought them into this union of love. We offer thanks to God for all the blessings and graces and favors that He bestowed upon those married couples until now and for all the remaining graces that they will receive in the future.

This Sunday we also have another celebration, the World Day of the Sick. The World Day of the Sick always falls on February 11th, because of the day on which we honor Our Lady of Lourdes. The Church wants to highlight the value of all those who are sick and suffering. Our Blessed Mother appeared to St. Bernadette in Lourdes, France on February 11th, 1858. Holy Mary revealed to her that she wanted this place to be where people would receive comfort and consolation in their suffering. Every year countless pilgrims travel to Lourdes to pray for healing through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother. Although not every person receives the healing, yet many do receive the consolation of peace to bear their sufferings. Lourdes is where Holy Mary shows her tender and loving heart, and her motherly care for all her children and in particularly those who are afflicted with various ailments. The World Day of the Sick, established by pope St. John Paul II, helps us to highlight that even in our sufferings Christ is present and wants us to be united with his redemptive suffering in our parish, our families, our friends, and neighbors. May through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother under the title of Our Lady of Lourdes they receive comfort, consolation, endurance, and hope. If we can, let us visit them so that they may know that they are not alone in their suffering, that they have not been forgotten. Let us remember what Jesus said in the gospel: "I was sick, and you visited me," and "whatever you did to the least of my brothers, you did it to me."

Lenten Regulations

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE.

The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to individual parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

2. Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

3. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as noted above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

4. The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

5. The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, February 17-18, 2024, to Trinity Sunday, May 25-26, 2024. However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

GUIDELINES FOR GODPARENTS/SPONSORS

Have you been asked to be a GODPARENT? Have you been asked to SPONSOR someone ready to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, or for an adult in the RCIA program?

It is an honor and a privilege to be asked. You are seen as someone that a family, child, teenager, or adult looks up to as living a strong, Christian Catholic faith. You model that behavior in the way that you live your life.

To receive a sponsorship form signed and sealed by the Pastor, please keep the following in mind:

• I am age 16 or older.

- I am actively registered in the parish for at least 6 months.
- If married, the marriage is recognized by the Catholic Church.
- I attend Mass on a regular basis.
- I contribute to the support of the Church, as best I can. (Attendance is taken by the envelopes in the collection basket, even if empty).
- I receive Sacraments according to the Laws of the Church, and I fulfill the requirements listed above.

The Church takes very seriously the role of being a sponsor. Choosing a sponsor would be based on the person's dedication to the faith and regular practice thereof. Please do not ask us to sign if you do not meet criteria above.

Please register as a parishioner

Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think they automatically are registered just by attending Mass regularly in a particular parish but it requires a form to be submitted to the parish office with copies of sacrament records. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes such as, scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility form if requirements are met, a qualification letter from the pastor and receiving a year end donation tax statement. Weekly collection envelopes are used to track attendance at Mass. Registration in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
