A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

On this Sunday we celebrate the World Marriage Sunday. The relationship between man and woman has been blessed by our Creator and established for the good of the children, for the good of the family, and for the good of the world. Marriage is a sacred bond between the husband and wife, and a vocation. Marriage binds two distinct individuals into a union of love and fidelity. Love binds the husband and wife in their heart and in their will. However, this love depends on the fidelity that provides a necessary commitment to authenticate relationship that seeks the good of the other spouse and is not swayed by desires of the body.

Marriage provides a necessary stability and security to the man and woman through their partnership to bring forth life of their children into the world. The children are a natural outcome of the loving relationship that the couple have because love is always fruitful and life giving, it never remains sterile. In today's world, however, the choice to have many children is often met with fear and worry. Our Catholic Faith always encouraged the parents to have many children, because the children are considered a blessing and a gift from God, but also because of our understanding that God seeks to bring people into heavenly life and there is going to be a plenty of space there. We will not be able to overpopulate the heavens because the power and love of God is not limited by our understanding of space and time. Those children that are brought forth by their parents after receiving the grace and faith of Jesus Christ are destined to become saints and to live with God in heaven.

Sometimes people are worried that the world is too small to accommodate the growing population, because of the limited space on earth and limited natural resources. However, we should never forget that it was the Lord who created the Earth and not man. 

Coming this Lent: The Resurrection and the Life

"Resurrection does not just describe what happened to Jesus after his death and burial. Resurrection is a past event, a future prospect, and a present reality." (Stephen Binz)

This Jubilee Year of Hope is a perfect time to focus on the source of our Christian hope, the Resurrection of Jesus. Jesus said, "I am the Resurrection and the Life." What does that mean to us and for us? How does the resurrection of Jesus give purpose to everything we do? How did the notion of resurrection develop? In this 6 week Threshold Bible Study we will attempt to answer those questions and more as we read and reflect on selected passages from the Old and New Testaments of the Bible, and read the informative and insightful commentaries prepared by Stephen Binz.

As a study, there will be assigned readings and reflection questions to completed at home each week, in preparation for the weekly 90 minute gatherings. These reflection questions will provide the topic for discussion during our gatherings. The weekly gatherings will also provide an opportunity for fellowship and prayer. All are welcome to attend, especially first time participants as well as those who are "listeners" rather than "talkers."
