A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

We have begun the Ordinary Time in the liturgical year. However, let us not be confused in thinking that it is a time during which nothing is happening. It actually refers to continuing our walking in the faith without additional solemnity. It is a time that we continue to order our lives in accordance with the gospel and we order our lives toward our greater union with Christ. We are in the time where we continue to grow in virtue and holiness of life, because our life in Christ needs continued attention and diligent work. We are never done, but we must always keep pushing forward toward greater spiritual progress in growing in the knowledge of God and of ourselves. We are only going to be done once we are in heaven itself, because even after we die, we might still need to go through purgatory. While many people with the start of a new year make resolutions to make changes to their lives, we Christians do not wait until new year comes. Because for us Catholics the time is a gift and we cannot afford waiting till the beginning of the new year in making changes to our lives, because the time is short to acquire new virtues, root out vices and to grow in grace. Our change in our lives in relationship with God continues year-round and we should always be eager to make new resolutions, because our Christian life demands it. As the disciples of Jesus Christ, we cannot remain the same. Also, we must be aware of another important fact that if we are not moving forward then we are sliding backward. This means that if we are not growing in virtue and holiness, then we will begin to fall back into our vices and sin and lukewarmness. Sometimes the thoughts may enter our mind that we have worked so hard in our spiritual life that we need a break. However, going along with such thoughts will only lead us to the loss of fervor and diminish in us the sense of urgency and may lead us to a deadly spiritual sloth. This may lead to undesirable results and the loss of all that we have gained through previous hard work and dedication. Let us remember that our love for the Lord should be our constant motivation and reason to keep ourselves on track in our commitment and resolve to follow Christ. Therefore, our prayer life needs to be well attended to so that the fire of love in our soul and in our heart may burn with ever greater intensity. We should constantly pray to the Holy Spirit that He may intensify our desire for prayer and love for the Lord. Our prayer will become more efficacious not for the multiplicity of words, but for the intensity of love with which we offer the prayer. Silent prayer of the heart can be more effective than prayer aloud because it demands a greater recollection of mind and focus on the one to whom we speak. The prayer of the heart also allows us to turn into ourselves and meet the Lord who is present inside our soul. While we can, we should always seek a place of silence, because it will be there that we are able to remove distractions and quiet our mind so that we can hear God speak to us more clearly. For it is particularly in silence that the Lord chooses to speak and reveal himself to us. The silence is golden not just in the movie theater, but especially for our good prayer life and spiritual growth. Let us remember that Christ prayed frequently, and he would go to isolated places, like the top of the mountain or outskirts of the town where he would not be distracted by the noise of the crowds, noise of the towns. We too should look for such places to have that intimate conversation with the Lord. In our parish we have Eucharistic adoration on first Fridays of the month. It is such a blessing to be with the Lord and in silence adore Him and speak with Him. It is my hope that more of us will participate in this special time with the Lord. If only we could realize what a blessing it is for us to be able to spend time with the Lord. The Church even offers a partial indulgence for those who would only spend half an hour before the Blessed Sacrament in adoration. Sometimes we wonder how I can grow in faith and love and hope more, but when opportunity arises, we pass it by and all those countless graces are not offered to us, because we do not seek them out. As we continue to walk in our Catholic Faith in following our Savior

Jesus Christ may this New Year be a time of making our resolution to take time to pray in silence and make an extra effort to spend time in front of His Divine presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Holy Mary, Mother of the Eucharist, pray for us!


