

### A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

With this first Sunday of the year there is so much hope and expectation as we embark on the journey of our faith leading us through this Holy Jubilee Year. Throughout this year we will have many opportunities to draw our attention to the virtue of Hope. This virtue is definitely needed in our times as there are many who struggle to have hearts and minds filled with hope. Throughout the year we will be moving through another year of grace and reliving the work of our salvation, and I will be bringing to you my parish family messages of hope. Also, throughout the year I will be bringing to your attention the articles of our faith as expressed in Nicene Cread that we proclaim every Sunday and Solemnity. Sometimes, we speak the words of the creed simply because we have memorized it by repetition. I will seek to help you appreciate more the words that you speak in professing faith. Hopefully, this will allow you to profess faith with deeper understanding so that it will not be just words, but meaningful declarations of the faith that we know, understand, proclaim, and love.

Knowledge of our faith is important to us. First, we need to be aware that this knowledge is a gift of God's own revelation. It is not just expression of some people's experience of God. It is God himself who speaks to us about himself so that we may come to know him as he is and not as we think he is. This an important point that we need to remind ourselves of occasionally, because it is easy to fall into the way of thinking about God that may not be accurate or imaginary. Each one of us can have different experience with God in our relationship with him and events of our life that have impressed upon us different view of God. Our Catholic faith, however, provides us with objective truth from God himself, who makes himself known to us. This compels us to shape our view of God in accordance with his Divine Revelation. It is true that sometimes we can use even divine revealed truths that God offers us about himself, and we can still draw wrong conclusions. Like many times you might have heard people say: "God is love, so it doesn't matter how I live my life, God still loves me just the way I am." This is just a small example how one can use a truthful statement that God revealed to us that He is love and fall into mistaken notion that God therefore must love my life even if it is not lived in accordance with his commandments.

Secondly, the knowledge of our faith helps us to know ourselves. From ancient times acceptance and conversion to the one true faith, the Catholic faith was called Enlightment. It meant that our mind was given the light of divine truth, and this truth enabled us to understand and grasp realities that without the faith we could never know or understand. How many times people ask the question: "what is the meaning of life? why are we here? Where are we going? These big questions can be difficult to answer for many and probably many too will just simply and honestly admit that they do not know. This is why faith is likened to light because the light helps us to see those things that without the light cannot be seen or comprehended. This of course does not mean that there are many things in this life that we can come to known and comprehend without the use of faith and simply using reason. However, even from the point of reason there is limit, because whenever we come to know one thing countless other things emerge, and we can never satisfy our mind or exhaust the knowledge that can be known. Faith provides us with rational answers about life and about ourselves, and the goal of our life. As a result of this knowledge, we can begin to live our lives with great hope and confidence, with assurance and certainty, with a clear path that leads us to the source and true end of our life that is found in God, the source of life. Therefore, my brothers and sisters in Christ, may we seek to know our Catholic faith well and deeply then the

knowledge of God as he reveals himself to us and deeper knowledge of ourselves with help us to better live our Catholic faith.

Our Lady of Hope, pray for us!

To receive a sponsorship form signed and sealed by the Pastor, please keep the following in mind:

- I am age 16 or older.
- I am actively registered in the parish for at least 6 months.
- If married, the marriage is recognized by the Catholic Church.
- I attend Mass on a regular basis.
- I contribute to the support of the Church, as best I can. (Attendance is taken by the envelopes in the collection basket, even if empty).
- I receive Sacraments according to the Laws of the Church, and I fulfill the requirements listed above.

The Church takes very seriously the role of being a sponsor. Choosing a sponsor would be based on the person's dedication to the faith and regular practice thereof. **Please do not ask us to sign if you do not meet criteria above.**

#### **RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)**




