

A Message from Father Euk

Isaiah 55 finishes the Book of Consolation (aka Part II or 2nd Is). It is a final call to conversion to a new covenant to fulfill God's promise to David and to be completed with Jesus Christ. Rain provides moisture for the germination and growth of seeds, while God's Word is to achieve the same purpose in souls. It takes faith, patience and perseverance to accept this truth. Isaiah rejoices in the effectiveness of the prophetic Word. God is fulfilling His promises and God rewards loyal followers.

Jesus meets resistance from obtuse and hostile people. They cannot understand Him because of their closed mindedness. They feel satisfied with what they have -and they feel they do not need more especially from Him. Jesus uses veiled speech and fewer public appearances: requiring active reflection by the listener. Only those who are properly disposed increase their knowledge of God. It takes being in the state of Grace and being united in one common belief found in the Word of God. Despite opposition from officials and disinterested people, just like today, Jesus expresses His confidence that God will triumph. He is not discouraged because of His confidence. He is never overwhelmed. Jesus knows where people have placed their trust and time will eventually tell the Truth.

Disciples are those who reflect and accept Jesus' message. They ask questions when they do not understand. Sometimes they fear to ask, but now they ask why He speaks in parables. Jesus declares a wall of division for those who believe and those who pick and choose what they think is best for themselves. Those of good will, having followed the Old Covenant, will be perfected in the New Covenant. Those who are satisfied with the old do not understand what Jesus is saying because they are biased in hearing things that they expect to hear. They are threatened by change or leaving their comfort zone. They have also complicated the old Law by adding to it to their material advantage.

Jesus explains that Grace is withdrawn when we choose to deliberately hardened our hearts toward God's Word. His symbols are meant to challenge people to reflect and seek to penetrate the Kingdom. The seeds that falls on the foot path are the "religious couch potatoes." They hear the Word, but do not make an effort to understand it. The devil, like a robber, carries the Word off and leaves them to their own devices. The seeds that fall on rocky ground are the "cafeteria Catholics." When it comes to the Cross, their joy fails under trials or self-discipline. The seeds that fall into thorns have very weak faith and fall into vice or give into anxieties by not seeking God's will for them. Finally the seeds that bears fruit are the true disciples who reflect, question and practice and develop virtue.

St. Paul reminds us that we are made for a purpose which is always challenged by the world the flesh and the devil. We must seek God's purpose for us and follow it in humility. While we do not always come up with good answers, a prayer life helps us to overcome these obstacles. By putting up with our crosses, studying the Sacred Scriptures and the Catholic Catechism, we can make a difference in our lives and come to enjoy God's will for us.

Let us pray that we never close our minds to Jesus' teachings expressed in Scripture and in the teachings of the Church. Let us pray for the obtuse people who have refused to listen and learn from Scripture and the teachings of Jesus' Church. Let us pray for life and liberty so that we can end abortion, euthanasia and racism.


