

# A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

This past week on July 11th we honor St. Benedict. This saint has been an inspiration to countless Catholic generations for his example of faith, but also for his humility. St. Benedict is considered the Patriarch of Western Monasticism. He is famous for his Monastic rule, which is a source of great wisdom to lead a good spiritual life, even if one is not a monk. St. Benedict lost his parents in his early adulthood and was left with the care of his sister St. Scholastica. He was inspired to live a religious life, like those Christians who would leave the world behind and dedicate one's life to study and prayer. St. Benedict lived in the times when Europe was in a decline due to various conflicts that have ravaged its lands, constant dangers from different invaders looking for the opportunity of quick gain of riches and wealth through raids and pillaging of towns and villages. St. Benedict formed a small religious community with man that too had a desire to live in religious community away from the turmoil of the world. St. Benedict and his companions have built first monastery on the hill of Monte Casino a very strategical location on the way from Southern Italy to Rome. Because many people would travel that way, the Benedictine monastery proved to be a safe stop for travelers, where they could find rest, and receive warm hospitality from the benedictine monks. The monastery in time became a beacon of commerce, but also a place where intellectual life flourished, through providing the education, coping of books like bible, but also many priceless works of literature, philosophy and various sciences, which could have been lost forever, but were diligently copied and preserved for future generations.

St. Benedict found many other monasteries, which provided a stability to the Christian life and culture, but also were instrumental in preserving the western civilization. St. Benedict was known for his great humility and faith, which proved to be of great help in combating spiritual attacks of the devil and in casting out demons from the possessed individuals. St. Benedict was a man of discipline, and one who promoted practice of the virtue of moderation among monks, but also among the faithful and clergy. Because of St. Benedict's efforts in preserving the good Christian values, the Europe was able to endure and pass through its difficult time. It also provided a springboard for the reestablishing truly Christian life and culture that have sprout into a blooming time of faith in the Medieval era. The time which today many describe as dark ages, which ignores the facts about this period during which great wonders of architecture were being built like those of great gothic cathedrals and advances in intellectual knowledge upon which the futures and today's sciences continue to rely. The Western civilization owes much to St. Benedict's work, which unfortunately is not being acknowledged or maybe purposely ignored. However, we Catholics should know this knowledge and promote it, because making people aware of how St. Benedict contributed to the development of our civilization also gives evidence to the good that our Catholic Faith is for the betterment of society and the promotion of the common good.

Having good Catholic friends will sustain us in this life, but also will be of help to us on our journey to eternal life. True Catholic friends will help us in holding us accountable in how we are living the Catholic Faith, but also, they will be the ones that will challenge us to give more of ourselves and not back down. Because our Catholic friends will share the same values and believes it would be easier for us to express our faith and to speak about our faith without fear of being misunderstood or the need to explain why we believe this or that. Let us never forget that the Saints are our best Catholic friends and that is why it is good for us to come to know them and their lives more deeply. They are a constant source of inspiration and motivation for our lives.

After the example of St. Benedict, we should seek to form small prayer groups to provide opportunities in our parish for support of one another so that we may be able to cultivate a deeper spiritual life, and to help us grow in knowledge of our Catholic Faith. We always need to go beyond our Catholic catechesis that we received growing up so that we may be able to become a more mature disciples of Jesus Christ. The small prayer groups will provide us with encouragement of our Catholic brothers and sisters who have the same goal and desire to live an ever more authentic Catholic Faith. The small prayer groups will give us opportunity to share our experience and methods that were of help to us to live better our Catholic lives. The small prayer groups will be a source of encouragement when we are going through some difficult times. It is of great value to have friends, but not all friendships are of equal value. It is my hope and desire that we can join together in this effort to form small prayer groups, because it will be a win for ourselves, but also for our parish. May St. Benedict pray for us that we may succeed in this effort, just like he was in his.

All parishioners of Our Lady of Hope Parish are invited to participate in book study and discussion on an extraordinary testimony of faith presented in the book entitled He Leadeth Me written by Jesuit Father Walter J. Ciszek, S.J. with Father Daniel Flaherty S.J. The book presents Fr Ciszek 's personal story of being captured by the Russian army during World War II, being convicted as a "Vatican spy', spending some 23 agonizing years in Soviet prisons and labor camps. Through it all Fr Ciszek not only endured but even turned the adverse forces of these circumstances into a source of positive values by drawing closer to God and reaching an inner serenity thru an utter reliance on doing God's will.

His book can help inspire each one of us as Christinas to a greater faith and trust in God even in the midst of our daily lives and challenges.

The discussion will be held on four consecutive Thursday afternoons at 1 PM at St Mary of the Assumption Church. The discussion periods will be 90 minutes on Sep 12, 19, 26 and Oct 3.
