



Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think they automatically are registered just by attending Mass regularly in a particular parish but it requires a form to be submitted to the parish office with copies of

sacrament records. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes such as, scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility form if requirements are met, a qualification letter from the pastor and receiving a year end donation tax statement. Weekly collection envelopes are used to track attendance at Mass. Registration in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish. OUR LADY OF HOPE PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS

All students **not** attending a Catholic school who wish to attend religious education classes here at the Our Lady of Hope Religious Education Program, levels 1 to 8, should register or re-register in our program. If you are not, please stop by the St. Jerome School office between 9:00 and 11:30 AM Monday to

Friday, or call the office 732-222-8686 at those times to have a form mailed to you. Our class lists have to be made and new books ordered so we are ready for the students.

Please do not plan to come and register your child on the first day of Religious Education classes. We will not be able to take care of your needs as we will be attending to all the students arriving for the first day of classes. Those who have reregistered will receive a schedule of classes for this year and other important information in the mail. Classes will begin for level 1 to 5 on Wednesday September 13 from 4:00 to 5:00 PM and for level 6 to 8 on Monday, September 11 from 6:30 to 7:30 PM. All reregistration forms are due by July 27th. Thank you and enjoy your summer.

Confirmation for this year's class will be on November 10, Friday at 4:00 PM. A schedule of classes and practices will be sent to you. Please plan to make every scheduled event. Nothing except sickness will excuse your presence for these important events. Bishop David O'Connell will be presiding. I still need sponsor forms from many of the students. Please choose someone who is eligible soon and drop off to St. Jerome School!

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

The month of July is a month dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus. Jesus shed much blood in His passion for our sins. His blood was a payment to the Divine Justice for our injustices. The word of God says that there is no forgiveness of sins without shedding of blood. The blood of the animals was used in the past as a substitute payment for the guilty. However, the blood of the animals could not take away the sin, but only appease God's wrath. Only the Blood of Jesus became the just payment to God, for only God could satisfy His infinite justice. Jesus, the Son of God, became a man so that by offering our nature and shedding of blood he could accomplish that which no one could. Only the Blood of Jesus, that was pour out, was of infinite value and merit. Therefore, during this month of July we turn to God and offer our thanks to Him, for making such a great gift and allowing His only beloved Son to become that sweet oblation that perfectly satisfies Divine Justice. The blood is the person's life and Jesus gave his life for us. He shed His blood until the last drop. He could have saved us with only one drop, but he gave all of His blood so that we may know the depth of His love for us, so that we may know how generous He is. The Blood of Jesus was the price that Jesus payed for our salvation, the price of our life. How precious is such a gift, that only God could offer. There was nothing, no payment, which we could make to God, which could gain us salvation. It was only Christ' Blood that obtain for us forgiveness, mercy and grace. Knowing the value of the Blood of Christ helps us to realize how good and loving our God is. The Blood of Jesus flowed out of his wounds like the wine from pressed crushed grapes. At every Holy Sacrifice of the Mass Jesus presents that same Precious Blood to the Father to plead for us for pardon and mercy. The same Precious Blood of Jesus washes away our sins when we participate in Holy Mass, when we participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. During Holy Communion, we drink His Precious Blood. However, someone may ask, how can this be possible, since I do not partake of chalice? We must remember that when we receive Jesus in Holy Communion we receive the entire Christ, His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity; we receive the risen Christ. The Body and Blood of Christ was reunited at the resurrection after being separated during His passion. Therefore, we do eat His Body and drink His Blood. The Blood of Jesus is the living water that flowed out of Christ as from the fountain. The Blood of Jesus cleanses us, heals us and gives us life. The Blood of Jesus is God's remedy for evil and sin that is why it produces fear in demons and evil spirits. The Blood of Jesus protects us from the evil influences of the devil that is why during the exorcism the exorcists calls upon the Blood of Christ. The devil and his hosts of demons will trouble all those who strive for greater holiness and virtue. However, we should not fear them but only trust the Most Precious Blood of Jesus. The devotion to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus helps us to be humble and grateful to God for offering us such a priceless gift. The most common prayer that practice this devotion is the Litany of the Most Precious Blood. O Most Precious Blood of Jesus, save us!


