A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

This past week the Church in America held the 10th National Eucharistic Congress as a highlight of the past years Eucharistic Revival, initiated by the American Bishops. The reason why the bishops called for the Eucharistic Revival was due to diminishing faith and believe in the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Every Catholic should know and believe that the Eucharist which is received in Holy Communion is the Body and Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. In every host and in every particle of the host Christ is truly and really present. The same Jesus who is at this moment at the right hand of the Father is at the same time substantially present in the consecrated hosts kept in the tabernacle and during the mass after consecration on the altar as well. To acknowledge this reality of Christ's presence in the Eucharist, when we enter the Church, we genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle to show our reverence, honor, and adoration to the one who is Lord and God miraculously present there.

The name of the golden enclosure where the Eucharist is being held is called the tabernacle. The reason why we call this object for storing the Eucharist the tabernacle is in reference to the Old Testament. God instructed Moses to build a tent for keeping and enclosure of the ark of the covenant. The ark of the covenant was a sacred object that God told Moses to make, with specific instructions. The ark of the covenant contained the tablets of the ten commandments. The reason for the tablets to be kept there was because God established his covenant with Israel by giving them the Law. The Law of God was inscribed upon those stone tablets by the Lord. The Law of God is sacred and a gift from God. Therefore, the ark of the covenant was a visible sign of God's covenant or bond with his people Israel. Because the forms of the past covenant between God and the people were only the foreshadowing of the true realities of the new covenant established by God through his Son Jesus Christ, therefore once the new covenant was established through the death of Jesus Christ so too the new realities were established in the new forms. Because the new and eternal covenant was established through the offering of Jesus's Body and Blood on the cross, therefore the Eucharist which is Jesus's Body and Blood is also the visible presence of that new covenant to the new people of God, the Church. Therefore, the golden enclosure for the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ is named the Tabernacle.

We genuflect to the tabernacle and before the tabernacle to witness our faith in Jesus' presence in the Eucharist. If the tabernacle was empty then we would not practice such a gesture, because there would be no presence of Christ there and the tabernacle itself is just an object and we are called to worship true God that Christ is and not idols. That is why the Protestants who do not believe in Jesus's presence in the Eucharist accuse Catholics of Idolatry for worshiping the bread. Obviously, we Catholics are aware of the first commandment, and we would not worship and adore the sacred host if Christ was not present there. We do not worship for example the cross, because it is only a symbol of Christ's passion, symbol of God's love for us. We only venerate or show respect for the sign of our Christian faith. That is why the true test for every Catholic is when we enter the Catholic Church and the tabernacle is not in the center of the Church, but on the side. The Catholic who knows and understands and believes in true presence of Christ in the Eucharist, would not just genuflect to the center of the Church where the main altar usually is, but rather he will turn to the side where the tabernacle is present to adore Jesus Christ present there in the Eucharist. Many times, we can practice gestures that express our faith, and sometimes we can develop a routine where without sufficient reflection we can make the gesture forgetting why we are doing them. That is why it is good for us to occasionally do a self-reflection and ask ourselves why I am doing this Catholic practice or another? and if I am not sure I should seek to know the answer. Every gesture that we do or practice in our Catholic Faith has a deep meaning and having strong and clear understanding of it will help us live better our Catholic faith.

Therefore, when we enter the Church let us be immediately aware that Jesus is present here inside the tabernac-le under the appearance of bread, hidden in the sacred host. May our genuflection, by falling on our right knee, be done with deliberate and reverent matter with a heart humble and grateful that Jesus our Lord and God is here. Whenever we pass by the Catholic Church it is also a good practice to make a sign of the cross to acknowledge our faith in the Lord being present inside Catholic Church in the tabernacle. We may even ask our Guardian Angel to go and adore our Lord Jesus Christ for us, since we may not be able to stop ourselves to do so.

Mary, Ark of the Covenant, Mother of the Eucharist, pray for us!

Deacon's Corner - Book Study and Discussion

All parishioners of Our Lady of Hope Parish are invited to participate in book study and discussion on an extraordinary testimony of faith presented in the book entitled He Leadeth Me written by Jesuit Father Walter J. Ciszek, S.J. with Father Daniel Flaherty S.J. The book presents Fr Ciszek 's personal story of being captured by the Russian army during World War II, being convicted as a "Vatican spy', spending some 23 agonizing years in Soviet prisons and labor camps. Through it all Fr Ciszek not only endured but even turned the adverse forces of these circumstances into a source of positive values by drawing closer to God and reaching an inner serenity thru an utter reliance on doing God's will.

His book can help inspire each one of us as Christians to a greater faith and trust in God even in the midst of our daily lives and challenges. The discussion will be held on four consecutive Thursday afternoons at 1 PM at St Mary of the Assumption Church. The discussion periods will be 90 minutes on Sep 12, 19, 26 and Oct 3.
