

A Message from Father Euk

Life after death was not part of Jewish thinking at the time of Solomon. In their thought a long life, wealth and children to carry on the family name was the reward of right living. What if we were offered three wishes that would be granted to us like we see in the fairy tales? What would we wish for? Our wishes will reflect our deep desires. What would God think of our choices?

God appears to Solomon in a dream and asks him what he would like. You would think that Solomon would ask for the things we would ask for, e.g., financial security, secure boarders, a good health plan, a respectful and unbiased press, etc.. Solomon is a new king and he is very young. He probably is very worried about his inner court. Will they take advantage of his youth? However, he does not ask for that. Rather, he asks for wisdom and discernment. Solomon has the humility to recognize his littleness, youth and lack of experience. He asks for an understanding heart to enable him to hear intelligently, to judge people, to see their inner motives and their actions so he could deal with them wisely. He asks for the ability to distinguish between right from wrong and to be obedient to God's laws and will. His father, King David, taught him well! When Solomon finishes the construction of the Temple in Jerusalem, he says a beautiful prayer that all world leaders should meditate on (1 Kings 8:12f).

There is another observation about Solomon's request. It seems to encompass not only wisdom, but wisdom and virtue. Plato taught that knowledge was the most important thing to have, but Aristotle taught that complete knowledge is impossible. Aristotle taught his son that wisdom is both knowledge and virtue. This way of thinking has been adopted by the Church and something we incorporate in our schools.

Jesus' parables share in three common elements that are clues to the nature of the kingdom. First, the value of heaven is an immeasurable gift. Second, it gives great joy to the finder. Third, it requires a total abandonment of all else to possess Heaven. Jesus can be found in one's ordinary life with diligent work by giving up vices and sins. Then we must take extra steps to go beyond good behavior.

It may sound like hiding the hidden treasure and moving it to another location is theft. Because of the unsettled times, people would bury their valuables for safety. There was a Jewish law that stated that what a man finds, he owns. So in purchasing the field, he becomes the owner of all that is in it. For us, the field is the whole world, but the treasure is the kingdom of heaven.

Ancient writings reveal pearls were more valuable than gold. The merchant is looking for the pearl beyond all price. The merchant has many pearls, but sells them all for the this unique valuable one. That one pearl of supreme value is Jesus Christ. In the Old Testament, treasure and pearls are symbols for wisdom. The final lesson is that a genuine disciple responds joyfully to the discovered kingdom with total commitment to acquire the kingdom. As demanding as renunciation may be, the parables do not stress the pain of renunciation. However, what has been found is worth every sacrifice because the reward is Eternal Life. Jesus also makes it very clear that all evil doers are gathered and thrown into a furnace by angles forever. Paul's Letter to the Romans addresses very difficult mystery, predestination. God is free to act as He chooses, but man is free to accept or refuse His blessing for us. No one is predestined by God to end up in hell, but only we can choose to make that choice. Jesus says, "If you love Me, keep My commandments."
