# A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday we celebrate World Day for Grandparents and Elderly, to highlight the value of those in later part of the human life. The saints of this past week can help us appreciate growing old and inspiration to spend one's remaining days of life with meaning and great spiritual fervor.

St. Bridget of Sweden was a mother of eight children. After the death of her husband, she founded religious order of the Most Holy Savior, and she devoted the remainder of her life to a life of prayer and devotion. Due to her great prayer life, she received from our Lord various private revelations about the details of Jesus' passion as well as other mystical revelations about Jesus's life. She advocated the return of the pope back to Rome. St. Bridget initial vocations as wife and mother she carried out faithfully, and after those responsibilities ended, she continued to live a vibrant life as a religious woman that inspired others by her example to live a more dedicated Christian life.

St. Sharbel Makhlouf became a monk of Maronite Rite in Lebanon. While living a dedicated life of monasticism, he chose to live the remainder of his life as a hermit. So even though Sharbel was already living his vocation or state of life as a religious man, he decided to push himself even further to a life of seclusion so that he might be able to give himself even more to a life of prayer and devotion. He practiced the devotion to Our Blessed Mother, but also engaged in acts of penance like fasting to detach himself from the worldly temptations of wealth and comfort. While living a life of seclusion, as a hermit, people sought him out for his gift of miraculous healings. After his death, the oil would seep out from his tomb, which would bring healings to those that applied it to the infirmed area of the body.

These saints show us that age is just a number and that the life of a Christian can always be taken to a new height of virtue, holiness, prayer, and devotion. While one may be busy carrying out one's responsibilities during the middle of life, the time of retirement or growing happily old certainly should not be a time that is uneventful or a time of just coping with old age. As these saints show us, and there are others like them, the life of service to the Lord always continues, but it only takes on a new turn. We should always remember that the life of prayer is crucial not only for ourselves but for the life of the Church and the salvation of the world. Even though the world may not see the value of prayer as essential to the human life, we must not be discouraged, because our life belong to God and the life of prayer fulfills our duty to him. Many may not consider a life of prayer as a valuable choice of spending one's own entire life, but that is because the world tempts us with a life that is empty, shallow, and self-centered. Christian life is a life that is not lived for oneself but for the Lord. We belong to God because He claimed us for himself. Our life is not our own but his. The more we realize this truth, the more we will be able to live our entire life in a way that is focused on living and deepening our relationship with God. If our heart and mind is set on the love of the Lord, then we will not experience loneliness, boredom or lose the savory of life.

#### Deacon's Corner - Book Study and Discussion

All parishioners of Our Lady of Hope Parish are invited to participate in book study and discussion on an extraordinary testimony of faith presented in the book entitled He Leadeth Me written by Jesuit Father Walter J. Ciszek, S.J. with Father Daniel Flaherty S.J. The book presents Fr Ciszek 's personal story of being captured by the Russian army during World War II, being convicted as a "Vatican spy', spending some 23 agonizing years in Soviet prisons and labor camps. Through it all Fr Ciszek not only endured but even turned the adverse forces of these circumstances into a source of positive values by drawing closer to God and reaching an inner serenity thru an utter reliance on doing God's will.

His book can help inspire each one of us as Christians to a greater faith and trust in God even in the midst of our daily lives and challenges. The discussion will be held on four consecutive Thursday afternoons at 1 PM at St Mary of the Assumption Church. The discussion periods will be 90 minutes on Sep 12, 19, 26 and Oct 3.
