

A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

This past week we celebrated the fourth of July. I hope all your plans, barbeques and fireworks brought you joy, much laughter and a good time with your family and friends. On the fourth of July we celebrate with great gratitude that we are living in this country and for the many blessings that we receive in being able to live in freedom to pursue life and happiness. This year I am celebrating 25 years of being able to live in this country and 15 years of being American citizen. I love this country and I am glad that I was able to come here to live among my Catholic brothers and sisters, whom many I have come to know and enjoy in my past years. On the fourth of July we feel the pride of being American and gratitude for those who in the past sacrificed their blood and lives so that we could live a better life. Because to be free and enjoy liberty requires sacrifice, we must always fight and keep vigilance so that we do not lose what others have given us at such a great cost, by giving even their all.

The month of July is a month dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus and it is so fitting that we celebrate our Independence Day during this month. Jesus spoke to the pharisees in John's gospel: "If the son frees you, then you will truly be free." However, they objected to Jesus that they were never in bondage, but Jesus explained to them that they are in bondage because of sin. Sin takes away our freedom and our liberty. The sin binds us in darkness and prevents us from coming to the light of God. The sin binds us in error that we can be happy without God and those lesser goods that we pursue will be able to satisfy our heart desire for love. Jesus truly knew that he needed to be bonded and led to the cross so that by his sacrifice and shedding of his precious blood he may purchase us back and obtain our liberty, our freedom of being truly children of God.

We are grateful to those who sacrificed much or all so that we could have liberty on this land, how much more grateful should we be for the liberty that Jesus Christ obtained for us through his sacrifice so that we may be welcomed into the heavenly land. Those in the past who fought for freedom knew the cost it would require of them to obtain liberty from the oppression of those rulers who used their power not for the good of their subjects, but for their own ambitions and selfish purposes. How many of us are aware of the cost that our liberty from the oppression of sin required? This is truly a great mystery, because we cannot comprehend the scope of the evil that sin has had, has, and will have on our lives. Only God truly knows the depth of the impact that the sin has on our lives. We experience or know this impact in a limited human way. However, the depth of this mystery is revealed in the cross of Christ, in his sacrifice and shedding of his blood. The cross reveals to us how our sins destroy and disfigure our nature. It shows the tremendous suffering that the sin brings to our lives and our relationship with God. The cross shows how sin wounds our nature. The cross shows us how sin immobilizes us and takes away our liberty to extend helpful hand and to walk in the path of righteousness. The cross shows us how sin pierces our heart and mind and drains us from joy and peace.

In the sacrifice of Jesus, we see the great mystery of how the sin to be removed requires an offering of oneself in an act of perfect love. Only the love that is so great that it seeks nothing for itself, but all for the one that it seeks to love. This selfless love has the power to break the bond that selfish love ties up the heart. The sacrifice of the Jesus is a gift of God's perfect and infinite love for which nothing can be exchanged but only received with humble and neverending thanksgiving.

Many in the past offered great treasures to pay for the liberty and for their life but nothing is of greater and priceless value than the precious blood of Christ, by which our dept of sin was paid and our life was purchased back. This precious blood of Jesus is of such a great and priceless value that even death itself is too little and it cannot match its worth. The precious blood of Jesus has such a power that it breaks the power of hell and extinguish its unquenchable fires. It is the precious blood of Jesus that restores us to true health, enriches us with grace, binds our wounds, restores us peace and joy, ends our suffering and brings us harmony with God. It is the precious blood of Jesus that brings life to our souls and love to our hearts. It is the precious blood of Jesus that puts us on path of righteousness and enables us to use our freedom for the good of our neighbor and for the glory of God. If only we could realize what a great gift a one drop of Jesus's precious blood can accomplish then pouring out his entire blood would fill us with great astonishment and awe that God in his goodness and mercy has shown to us, who deserved nothing, such a generosity. Then we would desire to offer constant praise to God for the priceless gift of his most precious blood.

Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think they automatically are registered just by attending Mass regularly in a particular parish but it requires a form to be submitted to the parish office with copies of sacrament records. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes such as, scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility form if requirements are met, a qualification letter from the pastor and receiving a year end donation tax statement. Weekly collection envelopes are used to track attendance at Mass. Registration in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish. GUIDELINES FOR GODPARENTS/SPONSORS

Have you been asked to be a GODPARENT? Have you been asked to SPONSOR someone ready to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, or for an adult in the RCIA program?

It is an honor and a privilege to be asked. You are seen as someone that a family, child, teenager, or adult looks up to as living a strong, Christian Catholic faith. You model that behavior in the way that you live your life.

To receive a sponsorship form signed and sealed by the Pastor, please keep the following in mind:

- I am age 16 or older.
- I am actively registered in the parish for at least 6 months.
- If married, the marriage is recognized by the Catholic Church.
- I attend Mass on a regular basis.
- I contribute to the support of the Church, as best I can. (Attendance is taken by the envelopes in the collection basket, even if empty).
- I receive Sacraments according to the Laws of the Church, and I fulfill the requirements listed above.

The Church takes very seriously the role of being a sponsor. Choosing a sponsor would be based on the person's dedication to the faith and regular practice thereof. **Please do not ask us to sign if you do not meet criteria above.**
