

Free transportation to the Mass and Rally for Life

Saturday, June 24, 2023 @ St. Mary of the Assumption in Trenton

The Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption in Trenton has announced that there will be a 9:30 a.m. Mass for Life on Saturday, June 24, 2023 just prior to NJ Right to Life's 11:00 a.m. Rally for Life. This day will mark the first anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's *Dobbs vs Jackson* decision that overruled the *Roe vs Wade* decision. The Mass for Life will conclude in plenty of time for Mass-goers to walk to the Rally for Life at the NJ Statehouse Annex, which is about four tenths of a mile from the Cathedral and about a 10-minute walk.

St. Michael's Church (800 Ocean Avenue, Long Branch, NJ 07740) is sponsoring a chartered school bus to take up to 53 individuals to the Mass for Life and the Rally for Life. **ALL (parishioners and non-parishioners alike) are welcome** to travel with us on this bus to these important events. Registration for a seat on the bus will be on a first come, first served basis. There will be **no charge for the passengers** who ride on this bus, however, we will gladly and gratefully accept a free will donation to help the parish cover the expenses of the bus and the bus driver's gratuity. Rest rooms will be available at the Cathedral in the church hall in the basement. There will be no rest room on our chartered school bus. Please feel free to bring your own "brown bag lunch" and snacks and bottled water etc. Do not bring signs and banners; they will be provided at the Rally. A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

On this Solemnity of The Body and Blood of our Lord, also known as Corpus Christi, we remember what a great gift the Eucharist is. The Eucharist is a great gift because God gives the gift and at the same time, He is the gift that is given. The Eucharist is not ordinary food even though to our senses it appears as such. The Eucharist it is truly Jesus' Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. Jesus offers us the greatest gift that is himself. Bread or wine by their nature can only nourish the body. When these elements are consecrated, they cease to be what they are and are change into Christ. We call this change transubstantiation, because the substance (what something is) is changed. The accidental aspects that are perceptible to our senses remain the same. The great miracle takes place at every mass for God changes these ordinary elements into himself. The miracle of the Eucharist is a great mystery that goes beyond our ability to comprehend the reality of it. Miracle cannot be explained by science, because it violates the laws of physics and nature. Although, we fail to understand it with our reason, we do not remain in the dark without any understanding, because our mind is enlightened by Faith. Jesus himself told us that He is the bread that came down from heaven. Jesus also dismissed the notion that the food that He offers is ordinary pointing to the result that those who eat it will live forever. We know, that there is no food or bread in the world, by which we can live forever. We eat bread and yet we still die. Therefore, you see my brothers and sisters that the food that Christ offers us is not natural, but supernatural. Since, only God can offer us such food, we must not doubt that He as Almighty God lacks the power to do so. After all, Christ proved this to us in multiplication of bread and fishes, through change of water into wine. He who created the world out nothing, could not change bread and wine into his own body and blood? Unthinkable. God is All-powerful and He can do all things.

Since, the Eucharist that we receive is Christ himself; therefore, we cannot treat Him without proper care, attention or casually. In the Eucharist, we receive Christ, who is living and truly present to us. Since we received Christ who is the Son of God, we must approach Him with faith and adoration, with reverence and humility and especially with the pure heart. Christ seeks to enter our hearts and therefore we have the utmost responsibility to receive our King and Lord worthily so as not to offend Him. Therefore, we must always remember that no Catholic that is aware of mortal sin can receive Holy Communion, but first must go to the sacrament of penance. Anyone receiving Holy Communion while conscious of mortal sin on his soul commits another grave sin called sacrilege. Act of Contrition does not replace sacrament of penance to remove grave sins. Not going to confession for more than a year is a grave sin. Even if one has not committed any mortal sins still must go confession at least once a year. Receiving the Eucharist worthily requires that we are first and foremost in the state of grace that is without mortal sin on the soul. We must receive the Lord in the Eucharist with Faith that is we must believe that He is truly there. When we receive Christ in the Eucharist, we make an act of Faith in Him. We also testify that we believe all His teaching as proposed by the Catholic Church. If a Catholic does not believe all the teachings of Christ as proposed by the Catholic Church, he should not receive the communion for rejection of Christ's teaching is also rejection of Christ. Since in Holy Communion we seek to be united with Christ, who is truth, we must accept and believe His entire teaching to truly enter into union with Him. May the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus have mercy on us and strengthen us in resolve to practice reception of Him in Holy Communion with greater attention, faith and love.


