## A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

This week we celebrated two great Saints: St. Thomas Moore and St. John Fisher. The reason why I described them as great is not because other saints are not great, but because of their heroic witness to the faith. Those two saints were found in the midst of the storm that they did not anticipate could have happened in the place that they lived. St. John Fisher was a bishop of Rochester, England and a Chancellor of Cambridge University. St. Thomas Moore was a chancellor of England in the service of King Henry the VIII. King Henry the VIII received the title from the pope "the Defender of the Faith" for his insistence on churches dogma, sacraments and fidelity to the Catholic Church. However, about a year after he received this recognition by the Holy Father, the King decided that he wanted to divorce his wife, Queen Catherine. He sent the request to Rome to obtain the permission from the pope to have his marriage dissolved. However, the pope did not grant such a decree since the valid marriage is a permanent bond and it cannot be dissolved. King Henry the VIII in response to popes' refusal to grant such a decree declared himself the head of the Church of England and have renounced papal authority as having jurisdiction over the Church in England. The King then decreed that all subjects, including those in Church's hierarchy must make an oath of declaring that the King is the head of the Church of England and not the pope.

Most of the clergy and aristocracy did sign this declaration, because not to do so meant treason and was punishable by death. St. John Fisher, however refused to sign the oath, because rejection of papal authority was direct attack on the teaching of the Church, and rejection of the will of Christ, who established this Petrian Office. The papal authority lies in the words of Christ who said to Peter" I say to you, you are Peter and upon this rock I will build my Church and the gates of Hell will not prevail against it". Lack of union with the Sea of Peter, with the pope meant also separation from the Church and Christ. So, St. John Fisher understood well the gravity of the situation, but preferred rather to lose his life than to be separated from Christ and his Church. He understood that the kings' demands were unjust, and it was better to be found a traitor to the earthly ruler rather than betray Christ, the Divine Ruler. He was ultimately beheaded and by his undeterred Faith gained the crown of martyrdom and eternal glory of heaven.

St. Thomas Moore was a man of great Faith and integrity. He was well trained in virtues, but also in understanding of law and justice. He was a man of conscience, who understood well that that the decisions and choices have consequences, both in this life, and the eternal life. Despite the great position that he held as chancellor of England, and the great pay and benefits that afford him a comfortable life, Thomas knew the true value of life and the value of Faith. He understood well that one should not be driven by one's own desires and wishes, but by the dictates of truth and reason. Thomas had a wife and daughter that he loved greatly, yet he understood that the love for this life or his family could not be put above the love of God and fidelity to the one, true Faith. He understood were the human authority ends and its limits are. He did not deny the king's authority to rule, and he strived always to be king's good subject. He was aware that the earthly rulers received their authority from God, however he recognized that the rulers could not usurp the authority that they did not have.

No human authority can justly exercise its authority by opposing the authority of the Creator. The natural law and divine law established and given by God will always prevail over any human authority. That is why when God established marriage as an institution that is a permanent bond between man and woman. This bond can never be broken and the Church that possesses Divine Authority from Christ to bond and lose cannot declare marriage to be broken, because this would oppose God's will and his divine law. The Church has no authority to unbind the marriage, that was bonded by God. To declare by the Church that the valid marriage is dissolved, or the couples are divorced would be null and void and it would have no force of the law. Thomas knew that the reason the king denied papal authority was to allow himself to divorce his wife and marry another. Since the king desired to obtain the heir for the crown and Queen Catherine was not conceiving, he blamed his wife for not granting him the gift of a son. Although Kings' concerns about the royal lineage to continue were understandable, yet it did not grant him the exemption from the laws of God. Thomas knew that the king was abusing his kingly office and to go along with King's plan would be unjust and not only it would violate the law of God, but also Thomas' well-formed conscience, his fidelity to the one, true Faith and reason. Because Thomas was in good favor with the king, he was initially imprisoned, however after some time the king was advised to remove Thomas Moore as the final obstacle to legitimize king's action. After a setup trial, where the judges already had a verdict decided before it began, Thomas Moore was beheaded and by his undeterred faith, gained the crown of martyrdom and eternal glory of heaven.

May the examples of these two great Saints be an inspiration for us. May we live our Catholic faith undeterred in holding on to the laws of God, our Catholic teaching, and to reason that the good ends do not justify obtaining them by evil means.

St. John Fisher and St. Thomas Moore, pray for us!
