

A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

I mentioned last week that the month of June is dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This devotion is celebrated to highlight an important truth that Jesus's heart loves us so much and desires to be loved by us. Jesus is united as the Son of God to our human nature and therefore has a human heart that beats with love for us sinners. This heart of Jesus which suffered so greatly in the passion of our savior, which was wounded for our offenses and continues to suffer for every sin that we commit. Jesus' heart continues to suffer because it loves us so much. When it receives from us coldness or indifference instead of love and gratitude it causes the heart of Jesus a great anguish. Jesus has a great desire in his heart to pour his love upon us, but we need to be open to receive his love. Jesus cannot offer us his love against our will, but only when we humbly welcome his love into our hearts and when we seek his love with a complete trust like a child. It gives Jesus' heart a great relieve and consolation whenever we spend time in adoring his presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament. It is particularly there that Jesus longs for us to pour out his grace and mercy so that we can increase in our love for him.

We may ask why adoration? It is because love is an act of the will, we need to choose to love Christ. How easy it is for us to choose to love other lesser things rather than loving him above all things. Each Catholic would claim to love Jesus, but the concern lies in the priority of the desires of the heart. Do I truly love Jesus above all things, even above my life or is my love for Jesus on the same level as the love for other people or other things? It is a daily challenge that each one of us must face to love Jesus above all things. Since love is an act of the will, it therefore requires from us a dedication to train our will, our mind and heart in love of Jesus, and to truly practice love with consistency and fidelity. Each day presents to us different opportunities and challenges to love Jesus above all things. We need to develop a mindset that is focused on this reality. Everything that I should do throughout my day should be done for the love of Jesus. Every challenge or difficulty that I face I need to bear it with love for Jesus. The love of Jesus I need to seek in everything. It is the love of Jesus that is of greatest good or value that I have or can posses in this life and nothing can compare or measure up to it. It is therefore reasonable to engage in actions that will help us in training ourselves in the love of Jesus. The adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is such an activity. It will help us in reaching our goal to prioritize our love for Jesus above all things.

During the time of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament we are exposed to the consuming fire of Jesus's love. The divine presence of Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament will be affecting us on the deepest level of our being. Imagine yourself being like a piece of metal that is placed next to a source of heat. Over time the heat is absorbed by the metal and the metal begins to radiate the heat that it absorbed. Also, the metal when it becomes hot it even becomes pliable to molding, it loses its hardness or stiffness. This is what adoring Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament will do for us. It will increase our love for Christ. It will make our will mendable to the will of God. It will increase in us a desire to change ourselves, our life, our priorities, our values. It will increase in us a desire to seek holiness of life, because we will have a greater desire to be like the one whom we love, who is the object of our love. We will also grow in greater disdain for anything that opposes this love, that is preventing us from this love, that may move us away from this love. We will also grow in desire to please the one we love in anything and everything and to be ready to do anything that we may be asked to do no matter how hard or impossible it may seem. Adoring Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament will take away our fears and anxieties for this life since we will be focused on the love of Jesus and unquenchable desire to be love by him. We will also increase in our desire to love what Jesus loves. We will desire to make the love of Jesus known to others so that more people would respond with love to the loving heart of Jesus. The love of Jesus will become for us a joy in good moments and in times of suffering. The love of Jesus will move us from enduring sufferings to even seeking out sufferings for the love of Jesus. We will desire to become a mirror reflection of Jesus and his sacrificial love that he showed us in his passion and on the cross. Since God commanded us to love Him above all things, it is therefore our duty to love Jesus above all things and there is no better way to love Him than in Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

O Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, Have mercy on us! O Immaculate Heart of Mary, Pray for us!

Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think they automatically are registered just by attending Mass regularly in a particular parish but it requires a form to be submitted to the parish office with copies of sacrament records. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes such as, scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility form if requirements are met, a qualification letter from the pastor and receiving a year end donation tax statement. Weekly collection envelopes are used to track attendance at Mass. Registration in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
