A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

I shared with you about a beautiful devotion of the Stations of the Cross and its great value for our sanctification in Lent, but also in other times of the year as well. This Sunday I would like to draw your attention to another great devotion that we can practice growing in virtue and holiness during this sacred season of Lent. This devotion is called The Seven Sorrows of Mary. While Stations of the Cross focus us on the sufferings that Jesus our Savior endured, the devotion to Our Lady of Sorrow draws our attention to the sufferings that Mary his mother endured.

This Sunday from the gospel of John we hear that "God so loved the world that he gave his only beloved Son". Meditation and prayer on Mary's sorrows will help us grow in love of God through Mary. Let us remember, that no one on earth loved Jesus more than Mary his mother, and she out of all the creation continues to love Him the most. Marys' heart is so intimately united with the heart of her son that whenever her son's heart suffers Mary suffers with him. It is that perfect union of love of these two hearts that unites Mary to Jesus so strongly and deeply. Therefore, our devotion to the sorrows of Our Blessed Mother will lead us ultimately to the greater love of her Son.

Many Saints have promoted this devotion of Seven Sorrows of Mary or devotion to the Sorrowful Mary. Mary played a vital part in Jesus' plan of salvation and her sorrows too, were not without merits. Since Mary was given to us by Christ to be our mother, we should look to her for the example of how to follow Jesus as she did. Mary followed Jesus in everything, including in her sorrows, which for all of us can be a source of wisdom, inspiration, and knowledge. We all follow Jesus in our lives. However, life brings crosses and sufferings, which some of them can be hard to carry. Praying with Mary and reflecting on her sorrows brings us strength and consolation. In a way we are feeling being led by her through our own sorrows and we are learning from Mary our mother how to bear them with humility and trust in God. Not all sorrows of life can be resolved easily, some take much time and endurance, but with all of them we can be encouraged that we are not alone, but Mary our mother is there with us. She knows our sorrows and pains. Her motherly and caring heart is open to us, her children, always waiting to embrace us and comfort us. We do not even need to explain anything to her, for she already knows, with what we are struggling and what we are going through. Mary never leaves our side. Mary was with her son throughout this life, and she is with us throughout our life, until at last we will share with her in the glory of heaven. May this devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows help you to discover the new strength to love God amid suffering and sorrow.



THE SEVEN DOLORS (SORROWS) OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

According to a form approved by Pope Pius VII (1815)

V. O God, come to my assistance;

R. O Lord, make haste to help me

V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

(The Hail Mary is said after each verse.)

1. The Prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2:34-35)

I grieve for you, O Mary, most sorrowful, in the affliction of your tender heart at the prophecy of the holy and aged Simeon. Dear Mother, by your heart so afflicted, obtain for me the virtue of humility and the gift of the holy fear of God.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now, and at the hour of our death.

Amen.

2. The Flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13-21)

I grieve for you, O Mary most sorrowful, in the anguish of your most affectionate heart during the flight into Egypt and your sojourn there. Dear Mother, by your heart so troubled, obtain for me the virtue of generosity, especially toward the poor, and the gift of piety.

3. The Loss of Jesus for Three Days (Luke 2:41-50)

I grieve for you, O Mary most sorrowful, in those anxieties which tried your troubled heart at the loss of your dear Jesus. Dear Mother, by your heart so full of anguish, obtain for me the virtue of chastity and the gift of knowledge.

Hail Mary....

4. The Carrying of the Cross (John 19:17)

I grieve for you, O Mary most sorrowful, in the consternation of your heart at meeting Jesus as He carried His cross. Dear Mother, by your heart so troubled, obtain for me the virtue of patience and the gift of fortitude.

Hail Mary....

5. The Crucifixion of Jesus (John 19:18-30)

I grieve for you, O Mary most sorrowful, in the martyrdom which your generous heart endured in standing near Jesus in His agony. Dear Mother, by your afflicted heart, obtain for me the virtue of temperance and the gift of counsel.

Hail Mary....

6. Jesus Taken Down from the Cross (John 19:39-40)

I grieve for you, O Mary most sorrowful, in the wounding of your compassionate heart, when the side of Jesus was struck by the lance before His Body was removed from the cross. Dear Mother, by your heart thus transfixed, obtain for me the virtue of fraternal charity and the gift of understanding. Hail Mary....

7. Jesus Laid in the Tomb (John 19:39-42)

I grieve for you, O Mary most sorrowful, for the pangs that wrenched your most loving heart at the burial of Jesus. Dear Mother, by your heart sunk in the bitterness of desolation, obtain for me the virtue of diligence and the gift of wisdom.

Let Us Pray: Let intercession be made for us, we beseech You, O Lord Jesus Christ, now and at the Hour of our death, before the throne of Your mercy, by the Blessed Virgin Mary, Your Mother, whose most holy soul was pierced by a sword of sorrow in the hour of Your bitter Passion. - I receive Sacraments according to the Laws of the Church, and I fulfill the requirements listed above.

The Church takes very seriously the role of being a sponsor. Choosing a sponsor would be based on the person's dedication to the faith and regular practice thereof. Please do not ask us to sign if you do not meet criteria above.
