

- 1. What have been the joys and obstacles in your journeying together with the church? Please share a brief story that illustrates your experience.
- 2. What resonated most for you? What was most powerful? What touched you?
- 3. Reflecting on our conversation, how might the Holy Spirit be prompting you, and all of us as church, to improve the ways we are able to journey together?

A Letter from Father Sheldon

Dear Parishioners,

Have you climbed a mountain lately? I can only imagine the feeling of victory of mountain climbers upon reaching the summit after a slow and long climb. Especially that it can be treacherous at times.

Very often, the image of mountain is used in analogies to realities in life. Like when we say:

"I have a huge mountain to climb." That means someone is facing a big problem or a challenging situation. In the scriptures, when mountain is mentioned it speaks of God's presence. It was in mount Sinai where Moses received the Ten Commandments. The great sermon was in the mountain of Galilee. It was in the mount of Olives where Jesus

wept for Jerusalem. It was in the mount of Calvary where Jesus suffered and died to redeem the world. A mountain experience is an experience of God.

This Sunday, we are on the mountain of Tabor where Jesus transfigured in front of the three apostles. This event revealed in a glimpse the heavenly nature of Jesus. This is to give the apostles momentary courage and strength to continue to walk with their master to Jerusalem.

Our Lenten practice is a mountain experience with the Lord. We walk with Him towards Jerusalem - to another mountain that is Calvary. But we know we will continue walking and climbing to the mountain of Ascension.

As a Church we climb together in the mountain of faith. The Pope is leading us in the climb. It is with this thought that I remind you of an important event- The Synod.

Maybe you are not yet aware about the on-going Synod in our Diocese of Trenton. Yes, all the bishops, were asked by the Holy Father, Pope Francis, to begin the process in the parishes. Our parish, Our Lady of Hope has held two sessions already. Please check the bulletin for session schedule. Members of our parish gather in groups to share their church experiences. This is not to have discussions about problems in our church. The purpose is to gather information from the "pews" that would be helpful in the Synod of Bishops next year. Attendance is open to all. The Pope wants to hear the voice of His Flock. Not the Hierarchy, but those simple "Sunday Mass-goers". Your attendance is important. I hope we can have more active participation from our parishioners. I would like to thank those who attended and will continue to attend. Special thanks to Bill Nurthen and the Parish Pastoral Council, for spearheading this important process.

St. Michael's Church is inviting parishioners, visitors, friends, and the local community to come to the ass brothers and sisters in Ukraine. In addition to our prayers and spiritual support during the current War, we will be taking the following action during the weekend of March 12 and 13:

- Financial/Monetary Aid: A second/special collection will be taken up at all Masses during the weekend of March 12
 13 for aid to Ukraine. The funds will be delivered to St. Stephen's Ukrainian Catholic Church in Toms River and via tha earby parish to the Ukrainian Catholic Archbishop Most Reverend Borys Gudziak of the Archeparchy of Philadelphi or transmittal to Ukraine. Checks may be made payable to St. Michael's Church with a notation on the check's memo line "Aid for Ukraine." Bishop O'Connell has given permission for this special/second collection. Checks may be mailed to the parish business office at 800 Ocean Avenue, Long Branch, NJ 07740.
- Non-Monetary Aid: Humanitarian aid is also needed in the form of the items listed below such as medical supplies hospital and first aid supplies, non-bulky clothing and bedding that can be packed and shipped overseas, hygiene items etc. We will have collection boxes set-up in our church vestibule during the weekend of March 12-13 for these items to be dropped-off as you arrive for Mass or before/after Mass. 




