A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday falls on March 17th, which commemorates St. Patrick. It is attributed to this saint a gratitude for bring Christian faith to the people of Ireland. It is important to note that St. Patrick was not Irish. He was born in the lands of Roman Britain. He was kidnapped by the natives of Ireland as a young man and spend many years as slave in tending the flocks of his kidnappers. Many times, he feared for his life, thinking that his captors will find some reason to kill him, and his life will end too soon. Being a Catholic that neglected his faith, Patrick would turn to God in prayer for the strength to endure his captivity and to be preserved from harm. The time of his six years in captivity proved to be a time of deep conversion in Patrick's life. While living among the natives, Patrick learned their language, culture, and traditions. Eventually, he found a means to escape his bondage and he returned to Britain. Patrick completed his education and chose to serve God as a priest. In time he felt a call to return to Ireland as a missionary to bring Faith of Christ, to that place, where others feared to go. Patrick worked tirelessly to bring conversion to the natives. First, only a few converted, but after many confrontations with druids and lords of those lands, he eventually earned the people's respect. Patrick served there primarily as a low cleric in his missionary work. Only later in life that he received episcopal consecration in the line of apostolic succession.

Patrick used the knowledge of the culture and traditions of the natives to bring them to Christ. The natives of Ireland held water as particularly sacred and spiritual reality. This helped Patrick in introduction of Sacrament of Baptism and teaching about Christ as living water, and Holy Spirit welling up from the believer in true God. Since Ireland was covered in grass fields, he used a three-leaf clover as a way to teach about the Most Blessed Trinity. Eventually, Patrick brought an end to the pagan practices of the druids, which is referred as him driving away the serpents. Druids worshiped nature and elements of earth, fire, water, wind. Patrick helped the native of Ireland to turn to the true God who created nature.

Patrick was a true apostle to Ireland, who overcame the fear for his life in order to bring saving grace of Christ to its people. He showed a true love for God and the people of the Ireland in risking all for their salvation. Today's Ireland Christian faith is in a decline, due to collapse of Christian values in the society. One may say that the snakes have returned. Much of the Christian world is in dept to the Irish missionaries, who brought Christianity to Europe after its decline due to Vikings invasions, but also to many other continents around the globe that were waiting to hear the good news of the Gospel. Ireland like many countries need a new missionary who like St. Patrick would bring the faith of Christ anew. Let us rejoice and give thanks to God that granted such a great Saint to the people of Ireland, but also to all of us. May St. Patrick intercede for us before the throne of Christ, that we too may be willing to risk all in following Christ and in spreading the truth of One, True Faith, the Catholic Faith.
