A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

Our Catholic Faith uses many different symbols, traditions, and practices to give an external expression to our faith. These symbols help our mind to draw our attention to those truths and realities of our faith that cannot be experienced through our senses. These truths and realities that we believe in and live by. On the Ash Wednesday we used ashes as a sign of penance and desire to die to ourselves, so that we can be more alive in Christ. This Sunday we bless and receive palm branches, to symbolize our joy in the entrance of Christ into Jerusalem as our King and Messiah, who is coming humbly and in meekness to offer himself as a sacrificial victim, as a sacrificial lamb on the altar of the cross.

Another tradition or custom that we practice in anticipation of the resurrection of Christ is a blessing of Easter foods. This unique custom although not practiced in our country as widely as in other countries can help us to express our Catholic Faith in Christ's redemption in a very meaningful way. Living in Poland, this custom was always popular even for those Catholics who neglected the practice of their faith. Sometimes those simple expressions of faith kept the faith alive, especially under the oppression of atheistic communist government. I would like to share with you the deep meaning that this tradition has for our Catholic faith and in a way encourage you and your extended families to participate in the practice of this custom.

The food is normally placed in a wicker basket. The basket that is made from dried reeds and bound together which reminds us of the baskets that were used during the multiplication of the breads and fishes, the great miracle where Christ by his divine power fed thousands of people who followed him. We too follow Christ, and we seek to be feed by his truth and grace. The baskets are decorated with greenery to show the life that we have is also attached to Christ. The life of Christ brings life to our life that is dried out from lack of grace and those various sins that binds us or entangle us. The opening of the basket can be covered by nice cloth for the protection of foods from any dust or dirt that could fall on them while we are bringing the baskets for the blessing to the church.

Each food that goes into the basket has particular meaning connected to faith. The first food that is a symbol of new life are eggs. These should be hard boiled eggs that can be cooked with different colors to stain the eggs shells. My family cooked eggs with dry onion skins, which gave the eggs wonderful brown color. The reason that we color the eggs is because Christ's redemption and resurrection brings life and beauty to our gray and mundane life. These eggs will be cracked and eaten during the Easter breakfast. The cracking of the egg's shells on Easter Sunday will remind us that Christ broke open the tomb in his resurrection. The eggs that we will partake of will symbolize the receiving of this new Life of Christ, just as we through our sacrament of baptism partook in rising to the new life of grace with Christ.

The Second food that we place in the basket is some type of bread. This food symbolizes that Christ is for us a bread that came down from heaven, and this true bread that Christ is for us and on whom we are feed, sustains and increase in us this new life of grace that Jesus obtained for us in his Paschal Mystery, by his death and resurrection. Each person should partake of the piece of this bread on Easter as sign of hope that we place in Christ, who leads us to eternal life of heaven.

The third food that we place in the basket is some type of meat. It can be ham, bacon, sausage, lamb, something that is already cooked. The meats are a symbol of Christ as a paschal lamb. The Israel people were told to eat the flesh of roasted lamb during Passover feast to commemorate being set free from the bondage in Egypt, which was a prefigurement of Christ, the true lamb on whom the people of God would feed and the lamb of God that truly sets us free from sin and preserve us from eternal death. The links of sausage are a symbol of the chains of death that Christ broke through his resurrection.

The fourth food is cakes and sweets. This food symbolizes for us the new life of Christ, by which we experience the delights that his grace and love brings to our hearts and souls. We partake of these cakes and sweets as a reminder of the hope that is in store for us in the life of heaven with God and the joy that Christ victory over death brings to our hearts.

The fifth food is salt and spices. Jesus said that we are 'the salt of the earth.' Salt is the symbol of the grace of faith that we have received, which preserves us from the corruption of sin. The spices symbolize the faith in Christ, which like the salt brings flavor to our life.

The sixth food is a horseradish a symbol of the bitterness of the slavery in Egypt and the passion that Christ endured for our salvation.

The seventh food is cheese which is a symbol that should remind Christians to practice moderation in everything.

We can place a lamb made from butter or cake or chocolate as a symbol of Christ our Paschal Lamb, who through the sacrifice on the cross and resurrection have won the victory over sin and death and have brought reconciliation between us and God. The butter is a symbol of the richness of the grace that overflowed from Christ's death and resurrection.

We can also place chocolate easter bunnies, because in accordance with Christian tradition, the bunny who sleeps with eyes open was the first animal that witnessed Christ's resurrection.

In some countries people also place the bottle of wine, as a symbol of the wine of salvation that is the precious blood of Christ, which was shed to obtained for us the forgiveness of sins and the joy of new life in Christ.

This coming Holy Saturday we will have the blessing of Easter foods. It is my hope that all will be able to join in this truly Catholic tradition. It is also my hope that as you partake of these blessed foods on Easter Sunday during your family meal, that you will be able to appreciate even more the deep meaning of the blessings that Jesus bestowed upon us through his Paschal Mystery, his death and resurrection.

Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think they automatically are registered just by attending Mass regularly in a particular parish but it requires a form to be submitted to the parish office with copies of sacrament records. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes such as, scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility form if requirements are met, a qualification letter from the pastor and receiving a year end donation tax statement. Weekly collection envelopes are used to track attendance at Mass. Registration in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish. - I am age 16 or older.
- I am actively registered in the parish for at least 6 months.
- If married, the marriage is recognized by the Catholic Church.
- I attend Mass on a regular basis.
- I contribute to the support of the Church, as best I can. (Attendance is taken by the envelopes in the collection basket, even if empty).
- I receive Sacraments according to the Laws of the Church, and I fulfill the requirements listed above.

The Church takes very seriously the role of being a sponsor. Choosing a sponsor would be based on the person's dedication to the faith and regular practice thereof. Please do not ask us to sign if you do not meet criteria above.
