

A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday our Lord speaks to us in the gospel about love. The Eucharist is the greatest sacrament of love. Because in the Eucharist, our Lord offers himself or in other words lays down his life for us so that by his self-offering to the father we may receive pardon and forgiveness for our sins. In the Eucharist God offers us his love because he offers himself to us in total self-gift. God is love as John the apostle tell us so when we receive the Lord in the Eucharist, we truly receive love. We receive love that is not a feeling or sensual experience, but the One who is the source of love, because He is love itself. Every act of God is an act of love. Even when God exacts justice and punishment for evil it is always done in love and out of love. For God loves goodness and justice and therefore his love is always an act of perfect justice and perfect goodness. God's love is always perfectly just, because it is done in truth and in accordance with perfect harmony in God as the most perfect and supreme being, but also in relation to all of his creation.

The gift of the Eucharist helps us to grow in love, because the result of receiving our Lord into our being, causes our hearts to become inflamed with love. The Eucharist becomes like a fuel for our hearts and for our souls for it enables us to love God and others with ever new intensity and desire. The Eucharist increases our desire to love God and others and purifies that desire so that it is not contaminated by self-interest or by seeking one's own benefit. The Eucharist purifies our love so that we may be able to love God for his own sake, simply because he is God. Even though we receive many blessings from God, for which we should be eternally grateful yet our love for Him should be simply because he is Holy God. Also, the Eucharist increases our love for other people. By that love in the Eucharist, we see in them the love of God, because God created them out of love, and they are loved by him. Even though we must bear in love the imperfections of our lives and those of others we must never forget that we are God's loving creation and evidence of true wonder that all God' loving acts are.

Since the Eucharist is God who is love, who is the source of love and his gift of his love increases our desire to love, therefore we can understand why, when we are preparing ourselves to receive the Eucharist, we must respond with love to such a great gift that we are being offered. Jesus complained that many times when people or the clergy receive him, they do it with coldness, indifference, and little love. Such a great love that we receive in the Eucharist should be received with love that is burning with the desire for the love that comes to us so humbly and vulnerable. In the Eucharist we come to know God's great love that is so gentle and yet so intense. We need to receive the Eucharist with love that is full of gratitude that God would offer himself to us who are sinners and have many times spurn his love over the love of ourselves or other lesser things. We need to receive the Eucharist with love that is full of humility, that God almighty who is our Lord and King would desire to enter and abide in the heart of his creating beings who are his unworthy servants. We need to receive the Eucharist with love that is full of contrition that God show us his mercy and by the gift of his loving forgiveness spares us from the sufferings of losing his love forever but instead seeks to bring us to the joys of heaven to abide in his love forever.

The Eucharist is a heart of Jesus that beats with the love for us. Nothing brings to Jesus' heart greater joy and consolation for all the coldness and indifference with which his heart is being offended than by the love that we pour out from our hearts when we love him and adore him in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist. Therefore, whenever we come to the Church or even pass by the Catholic Church, may we always offer the act of love to our Lord, who is present in the Eucharist, inside the tabernacle waiting to be loved.

My God, my God, I love Thee in the Most Blessed Sacrament!

The Sacrament of Marriage

You must be actively registered for 6 months to schedule a marriage preparation meeting at least 1 year in advance of the wedding date. Please do not book venue before choosing date with the parish. Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think they automatically are registered just by attending Mass regularly in a particular parish but it requires a form to be submitted to the parish office with copies of sacrament records. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes such as, scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility form if requirements are met, a qualification letter from the pastor and receiving a year end donation tax statement. Weekly collection envelopes are used to track attendance at Mass. Registration in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish. GUIDELINES FOR GODPARENTS/SPONSORS



It is an honor and a privilege to be asked. You are seen as someone that a family, child, teenager, or adult looks up to as living a strong, Christian Catholic faith. You model that behavior in the way that you live your life.

To receive a sponsorship form signed and sealed by the Pastor, please keep the following in mind:

- I am age 16 or older.
- I am actively registered in the parish for at least 6 months.
- If married, the marriage is recognized by the Catholic Church.
- I attend Mass on a regular basis.
- I contribute to the support of the Church, as best I can. (Attendance is taken by the envelopes in the collection basket, even if empty).
- I receive Sacraments according to the Laws of the Church, and
 I fulfill the requirements listed above.

The Church takes very seriously the role of being a sponsor. Choosing a sponsor would be based on the person's dedication to the faith and regular practice thereof. Please do not ask us to sign if you do not meet criteria above.
