A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

This week on November 22nd we will remember St. Cecilia virgin and martyr. St. Cecilia is a patron saint of sacred music and musicians. St. Cecilia lived in the second century and was born into a wealthy family. St. Cecilia is a patron saint of sacred music, because during her wedding she was able to hear in her heart the heavenly music praising God. She married her husband Valerian to whom she revealed that she took the vow of virginity. Her husband demanded proof of this, and she promised him that he would be able to see her guardian angel as confirmation of this vow, but first he needed to be Baptized. Valerian agreed and went to pope Urban from whom he received the Baptism. Upon his return he beheld the guardian angel next to Cecilia. He resolved to remain in a chaste relationship with Cecilia for the sake of her vow of virginity. Valerian and his brother were involved in burring of Christians martyred in Rome. Eventually they were arrested and put to death for refusal to offer sacrifice to the gods. Cecilia also was arrested and was sentenced to suffocate in the Roman Baths, however no harm came to her from this torture, so the executioner was dispatched to behead her. However, the executioner was not able to behead her after three tries. Cecilia only suffered from bleeding. She remained alive for the next three days, while she prayed and sang God's praises. Christians in the meantime would come to see her and to gather her blood for a relic. In 1599 her tomb was examined, and her body was found incorrupt.

St. Cecilia's beautiful testimony of her life revealed her great love of God, of the saints martyred and her family. In her lifetime St. Cecilia brought some four hundred people to conversion to Christ. She lived the love of God in her own life, and she shared this love with others through her preaching of the gospel. She shared her faith with others even at the risk of her own life. St. Cecilia showed great courage and resilience in her witness to Christ and promises she made to Him. The joy that flowed from her heart made her an effective evangelizer. Like St. Cecilia each one of us should share our Catholic Faith with joy, because we bring to the world the joyful news, the good news of the gospel and hope of salvation. The Christians were always encouraged to sign hymns, psalms, and inspired songs to cultivate a spirit of joy in their heart. Mary received the good news that she was going to be the mother of God, and this truth filled her heart with joy. We too have received the truth of our Catholic Faith and like Mary we are called to offer God our praise, thanksgiving and adoration with love and joy. May be not all of us have a great voice to sing, but everyone of us can sign from the heart the praise of God. This song of the heart that is most pleasing to God's ear flows from a life that is well lived in accordance with God's will in purity of mind, body, and heart. The more virtuous and holy life that we live, the more beautiful the song is, and the sweeter its melody is. For the life that is lived in holiness and virtue is worth a thousand words and inspires all to offer praise to God. May we strive in our own Christian lives to offer God always this beautiful song, for the praises of God are found in the assembly of the saints. May Saint Cecilia pray for us that we may be able to sing God's praises well in this life and join her one day to sing with the choirs of angels and saints in heaven.

Please register as a parishioner

Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think they automatically are registered just by attending Mass regularly in a particular parish but it requires a form to be submitted to the parish office with copies of sacrament records. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes such as, scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility form if requirements are met, a qualification letter from the pastor and receiving a year end donation tax statement. Weekly collection envelopes are used to track attendance at Mass. Registration in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish. Each year, the Saint Jerome children very generously give of themselves to raise money for the children and sisters in our missions in Adigrat, Ethiopia. They are our sister school.

Unfortunately, there is a dire need. During the past two years, there was a Civil war that has destroyed the area. The sisters survived and did the best they could to maintain the property. As soon as the war was over, more than 1,400 children came to the school. Now, the government has told the sisters if they do not build another Kindergarten (for school, eating and sleeping) they will shut the whole complex down. The cost to us is \$500,000.00!



Sister Ascenza, our General Superior (shown in the picture above) was afraid to sign the contract. Sr. Mary Elizabeth persuaded her to do so. "God will provide!" So here we are trying to do our part!
