A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

The last Sundays of Ordinary Time are focused on the Last Things. The four Last Things are: Death, Judgment, Heaven, or Hell. I shared with you last time about heaven. This Sunday I would like to share with you about Judgment. First, we need to be aware that there is a distinction between a particular Judgment and the Last Judgment. Particular judgment will occur immediately after death. The last judgment will take place at the end of time when Christ returns in glory. Sometimes we can be confused about these two types of judgment, and I believe it is worth an explanation to provide clarity to our Catholic believes. When each person dies, they will immediately be brought before Christ to face a particular judgment in which Christ will allow us to know our lives truly as they happened with both the good things and bad things. All the things that we thought about, spoke, did or failed to do. In an instant we will be aware of all these things, and we will be able to know them in a specific and clear way so that we will have no doubts about anything. This knowledge about specifics of our lives will also reveal to us the truth how God with his grace supported us and aid us through out our lives to bring us to Himself. We will know about all the blessings, gifts, and favors that we received from God and whether we have used them well or whether we have wasted them. We will also become aware of the true state of our soul. Our Guardian Angel and our Blessed Mother will advocate for us before Christ in our favor, just as at the same time the demons will accuse us for the evil we have done. We will really have nothing to say, because all that will be made known to us, is what is know to Christ as well. Jesus will make known to us where are we going either to Heaven, Purgatory or Hell. We will not argue or question anything, because we ourselves will recognize that the verdict is perfectly just in accordance with our life that we lived. Jesus throughout the gospel spoke about this event frequently and using many parables and images revealed to us that this particular judgment will take place right after our death. Jesus also spoke to us about the Last Judgment which will take place at the end of time when human history comes to its end in accordance with God's plan. During this Judgment God will reveal to all the people the extend of both the good and the bad that had on the life of the world. We will be able to see how the good that we have done to others had an impact on their lives, their families, and communities. In the same way we will be able to see to what extent the bad that we have done has spread in the world. At the Last Judgment we will also be able to see all those who are going to be spending their eternity with God in heaven or apart from Him in Hell. It will be an event that will show to all the victory of God' love over sin and death. God will be recognized by all as the only sovereign ruler of all the universe. God's plan for the humanity and the world will be completely revealed and known by all. Faith will no longer be needed because God will reveal himself for all to see. Those who are alive when the Last Judgement commences, will immediately receive their particular judgment. Both the particular and the Last Judgement reveal that God is perfectly just and that he loves goodness and justice. Therefore, let us imitate our God in love of goodness and justice, so that we may dread the judgment that we all must face. We need to trust in God and know that He has shown us mercy, so that by the help of His grace He may judge us worthy of eternal life in heaven. Our Lady of Hope, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Also, I would like to wish you all a Happy and Blessed Thanksgiving. Please know that I am thankful for being part of this parish family and I thank you for being such a great blessing to me.
