A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

This week we will gather with our families and friends to celebrate Thanksgiving. It is important to remember the many blessings we have received from God in this past year and to offer our thanks to Him. Giving thanks to God is an important act that teaches us humility and gratitude. It helps us to remember how much we owe to God in bestowing upon us so many good things. Each one of us can express the specific things that we are grateful for and probably there won't be enough time to list them all. However, it is good to name at least ten things that we are grateful for every day, so that we may not lose the sight of knowing how good God is to us.

Thanksgiving helps us in rooting out from our lives those sins and vices that undermine our love of God. Thanksgiving teaches us to live our lives with contentment of what we have. How easily it is for us to look at others and fall into jealousy or envy for their looks, talents, possessions, relationships. Thanksgiving helps us to see that all that we have is a gift from God and therefore what others have, is also a gift. Since it is a gift from God, it teaches us respect for God and his wisdom in distributing the gifts to each one of us in accordance with our needs. When we fall into thoughts of jealousy or envy, we are offending God for being unjust or unwise in his judgment in granting those gifts.

Thanksgiving helps us to grow in greater appreciation of the worth of the things that we have. How easily we can take those things that we have for granted, not realizing that some other person have not receive them and I was blessed to have them. How frequently do we realize the true value of those things that we have only after we lose them. Would not be better to be aware of their worth, while there are in our possession and be moved in our hearts to express our love and gratitude to God for them? If we practice thanksgiving then even if we lose various good things from our life, then we still will be able to express our thanks to God knowing that their loss is not a complete loss, but rather be aware that God will replace one good for another good that will always be better. If we live in the spirit of thanksgiving then we would be able to say like Job "the Lord has given and the Lord has taken away, blessed be the Name of the Lord". Thanksgiving teaches us to be generous with blessings that we have received, because it disposes our hearts to have concern for others. It diminishes in us self-concern and enables us to have a deeper love for others. Thanksgiving teaches us not to harbor good things for ourselves but open our hearts to the needs of others. In consequence thanksgiving helps us to root out from our lives and hearts greed and pride.

Thanksgiving teaches us patience and trust in God. Offering our thanks to God helps us to see that we are completely dependent on God, and it is through his constant care for us that He bestows upon us various blessings. Since all good things come from Him, we also learn to wait for those good things that He grants us to receive in an appropriate time. Because God is never late in giving us what we need, but rather he helps us to grow to trust in Him that even what it might seem like a delay is also a blessing that teaches us to rely on Him.

It is therefore no surprise that God would call us to worship Him by offering a sacrifice of thanksgiving, the Eucharist. Every Mass is a perfect act of thanksgiving, for through it we offer to God the Father a gift of His Son which is always the most perfect gift that we could present as our gratitude for the blessings of forgiveness of sins, and divine life of grace. At every Mass we are given the opportunity to express our gratitude to God in the way that on our own it would not be possible nor sufficient. For what can we offer to God since everything that we have is from Him and there is nothing that God needs from us for He is already perfect and complete in Himself. It is therefore we who are truly benefiting from offering our thanks to God, both for this life and for our eternal life in heaven. Therefore, may we never tire of thanksgiving, but may our entire life be a constant thanks to God. For we can never be thankful enough to God, and thanksgiving will be a never-ending act of praise of Him in heaven. May our Blessed Mother be an inspiration and example in offering our thanks to God.

Now, the government has told the sisters if they do not build another Kindergarten (for school, eating and sleeping) they will shut the whole complex down. The cost to us is \$500,000.00!
