That is the main theme of the entire season of Advent. This first Sunday invites us to reflect on the master of the house who went on a journey. He left his servants in charge. The master did not tell his servants when he was returning. He only told them to be watchful. He also warned them that he might come in suddenly and find them not ready.



What happens if the servant is not ready? I can only guess that the master won't be pleased.
