A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

The month of November is dedicated to the remembrance of those who have departed from this life, and it is a special time in the Church that our attention is given to those faithful souls who have not yet completed their purification in purgatory. Although there is much good that each one of us can accomplish during our life, our weak human nature is also prone to sin. The sin accrues the debt of punishment, deforms our soul and sow vice in our life. The sin undermines our goodness and makes us unfit for eternal life with God in heaven. The purgatory is a place where God in his mercy and justice prepares those souls who were judged worthy of eternal life but have unfinished work of sanctification. The amount of time that the soul will need to spend in purgatory is determined by God's Divine Justice. The soul by its prayers cannot shorten or speed up the time that it needs to spend there to complete her purification. The souls in purgatory are encouraged to persevere in the hope of knowing that they will share in the happiness of heaven once their purification is complete and debt of sin is paid. Remember how Jesus in the gospels speaks to us about this reality, when he says: "settle with your opponent quickly, otherwise he will hand you over to the judge and the judge will hand you over to the constable and you will be put into prison, and you will not be released until you have paid the last penny."

That is why in our Catholic Faith we pray for the souls in purgatory or the faithful departed. In our faith we believe that we can be of help to those souls by our prayers and sacrifices to complete their purification so that they may enter heavenly life sooner. At every Mass we pray for the faithful departed. From each Mass the souls in purgatory receive consolation and relief from their sufferings by the graces flowing from the sacrifice of Christ that is being offered. Each Mass offered offers immeasurable graces for those souls who suffer great pains from purifying fire. We cannot begin to imagine the suffering that those souls must endure while there. That is why, moved by compassion for their sufferings we make effort to assist them by having Masses being offered for them. This is the reason why we ask the Church to have Masses being offered for our departed loved ones. It is our hope that our departed loved ones will be in heaven. Even though we cannot know whether they are there already and knowing how imperfect we are and how our lives many times do not reflect the life of Christ, we count on the mercy of God. We offer prayers for our faithful departed in the hope that our prayer will be of help to them so that they may enter eternal peace soon.

Unfortunately, the understanding of this reality of purgatory sometimes is being undermined by the belief that we all are good, and sin do not play a big part in our lives. This rose-colored view of life is a result of relativizing the seriousness of sin and its consequences on our relationship with God. When sin is only seen as a weakness and not violation of justice and divinely established harmony then it is considered of little importance to the final outcome in regard to our eternal life with God. Even if we may not loose our salvation because of the grace of Christ let us not forget that by the divine revelation we are reminded that we may only enter heaven if we are found without spot or wrinkle. Our soul needs to be completely holy and perfectly free from any imperfections caused by sin and free from attachments to sinful habits. The soul needs to be crystal clear so that it may be filled with the light of God's glory. Even though we may die in the state of grace that is without mortal sin on our heart, we need to be mindful that most of us do not do enough penance during our life to be able to go directly to heaven after our passing. However, each Mass including the funeral Mass offered after our passing will be of great benefit to us to complete our work of penance in purgatory and to enter the joys of heaven sooner. Let us always remember the suffering souls in purgatory and offer masses, prayers, and sacrifices on their behalf. They will be forever grateful to us for our help, and we will also receive grace from God for this act of mercy.
