

A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

The Month of November is a particular time that we remember in our prayers our loved ones, who have gone in faith to the next life. The month starts off with November 1st celebration of All Saints, followed by November 2nd All Souls Day. On All Saints Day we honor all those saints that are in heaven which are not known to us. The saints that are those faithful departed who have reached their destination of eternal life with God in heaven and are enjoying the fullness of life, happiness, and peace. We honor those saints and all the saints with longing to hopefully join them one day. The saints in heaven have no need of our honors since they are honored by God in a perfect way. However, we honor them with a plea that they will intercede for us before the throne of God for the grace that we may remain faithful to the end of our days in this life. On All Souls Day we mark the day in remembrance of all those faithful departed who although have been found worthy of salvation but are not yet ready to enter the glories of heaven. The souls of those faithful departed are not yet completely holy and perfect and need to go through the process of purgation. They are undergoing the removal of stains from the sins of earthly life. They are completing their penance for venial sins that they have retained on their souls either through neglect or lack of knowledge or awareness of these specific sins. St. John of the Cross explains this through analogy of glass. The glass can appear to be clean, but when the light hits the glass all the stains begin to appear. These souls are also being perfected through suffering from their vices, so that their will is ordered properly to the love of God. Once the souls complete their purification they will shine with beauty and brilliance of God's divine light, like stars in the sky. These souls cannot shorten their time in purgatory, since their life was already judge by God and all that they have done in earthly life cannot be amended or changed. However, they can receive help from us. We can help those souls to satisfy God's justice, by offering for them prayers, fasting, and good works, works of mercy or even the smallest sacrifices. The most powerful way to aid those souls is to have Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered so that they may receive the bountiful grace of Christ's sacrifice. St. Thomas Aquinas considered that out of all the works of mercy, praying for those souls in purgatory had the greatest merit, because those souls in purgatory will not be able to repay us in the same measure for our help to them. You might say they will forever be in dept to us for our act of love toward them. Remember that any act of mercy that we do to others will not go without merit and the Lord will reward us in heaven for our mercy with greater glory and happiness. Praying for souls in purgatory is a double benefit one to those souls and one to us. Most of us will have to spend some time in purgatory before we go to heaven unless we engage in serious penance in this life. St. John of the Cross commented on this point that one hour of suffering in this life will have more efficacy on our soul then one hour of suffering in purgatory. In this life there is a limit to intensity of suffering that we can bear due to limitation of our bodies, unlike in purgatory where we will be only with our soul, which is a nonphysical reality. However, it is important for us to remember that not all suffering in this life can account for paying down our dept for our sins to shorten the time in purgatory. We must always remember that we must make a conscious resolution, a choice, to unite our suffering with that of Christ on his cross and offer it for the sins of our past life or suffering souls in purgatory. Otherwise, our suffering will have no merit toward the next life. Therefore, during this month of November particularly, but even beyond it let us be aware of those suffering souls in purgatory who await our loving help. Let us pray for them and do whatever we can to help them in their need. Let us not forget about them, because they could be our loved ones, who we might think are already in heaven while they are still in purgatory and would be eternally grateful for our help and compassion. Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon them, may they rest in peace. May the souls of all the faithful depart through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.

Commentary on Financial Summary

Dear Parishioners:

I am pleased to report this week on the financial results for the parish for the 2022/2023 fiscal year [July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023] and the budget for the 2023/2024 fiscal year. Our goal each year is to be transparent about your parish's financial activity, which includes St Jerome and St Mary Churches and St Jerome School. This summary has been reviewed and approved by the parish's Finance Council.

Our financial results have remained positive, as reflected in the attached Financial Summary. I thank all of you for your support that enabled us to achieve these results.

Our operating income in 2022-2023 declined by \$43,000 from the budget we reported last year to \$132,400, and we project a decrease in 2023-2024 to \$53,000.

The- primary reasons for the decline from budget were a \$21,000 decrease in weekly collections, higher utility and maintenance costs of \$38,000 and higher costs of capital projects, net of funding, of \$53,000. These factors were partially offset by a net increase of \$27,000 in fundraising from the Gala and the Gift Auction and a decrease in school salaries and benefits of \$63,000.

The key assumptions in the 2023/2024 budget include:

- a—a decrease in K-8 enrollment to 208 students and an increase in the PreK program to 45 children
- b—an assumption that weekly collections will be in line with the 2022/2023 level
- c---an increase in school salaries and benefits of \$116,000 due to an increase in staff related to expanded academic programs and higher benefit costs
- d—an increase of \$42,000 in bequests and other donations.

Capital projects—

We have segregated various capital projects and their funding sources in the summary to highlight them. Prior to 2021/2022, we did not spent funds on our buildings and fields due to financial limitations. However, we were able to secure several Federal grants totaling \$240,000 and were fortunate to receive several large donations totaling \$95,000 and utilize funds of \$37,000 raised from the Jumpathon fundraisers and prior Faith to Move Mountains rebates of \$40,000. In 2021/2022 these funds paid for a new school roof, major renovations to the church fields, a new Stem class-room and necessary boiler repairs. In 2022/2023, smaller projects were completed—a new rectory roof and siding and school flooring and lighting. For 2023/2024, we have budgeted funds for a new Saint Jerome Church roof, an electronic sign on Wall Street and a potential modular classroom.

We welcome any comments or questions you may have on the financial summary.
