A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

The Season of Fall has already started, and the beauty of creation is revealed in the change of the weather, the color and smell of the leaves falling from the trees in preparation for the winter season. The Fall season particularly inspires us to turn a leaf, to detach ourselves from those things that have overgrown our lives that we need to let go, that we need to let it fall off and die. We need to rake and clean up our lives so that the watering of God's grace can bring about new growth in virtue and holiness. The stripping of ourselves from those things that clutter our lives can help us to reveal what is truly important in life and for life. This is what saints did with their own lives so that they could make more room for their relationship with God. This Sunday falls on October 1st which is a memorial of the beloved Saint Theresa of the Child Jesus from Lisieux, France or also known as "little flower". St. Theresa gave up her desires for her own family, to be a mother of her own children, to share the beauty of marriage life. She chose to enter religious life as Carmelite nun, to detach herself from this world and to give herself completely to contemplative life. She gave up searching for her beauty, for nice clothing, and instead she embraced the covering of plain brown habit. She devoted herself to a life of prayer and love of her God and Savior, Jesus Christ. Even though she lost her mother while she was a young girl and died from tuberculosis while being only twenty-four years old, she has learned to love God in her brief life so intensely that she is an inspiration and example of love to Catholics throughout the world. She was declared a Saint by pope Saint John Paul II and Doctor of the Church on love. Her detachment from the things of this world became and continues to be a source of blessing and grace for countless who seek through her intercession to obtain various petitions and favors. Detachment from the things of this world will also be a blessing for us and like St. Therese we will be able to grow in greater love for God. This Wednesday on October 4th we also have a memorial of St. Francis of Assisi. He also like St. Theresa gave up all that he desired for this life and embraced the life of poverty, simplicity, and charity. St. Francis took to the heart the words of Christ who calls us to detach ourselves from this world "If you want to be my disciples then you must deny yourself, pick up the cross and follow me". He was a son of a rich merchant family, and he could have an easy life and a comfortable life, instead St. Francis chose Christ above all things of this world. He believed that to lose all things for Christ was not a loss, but gain. Because of St. Francis' love of Christ many other Christian man were inspired to follow Christ like him. This radical love of Christ also inspired St. Clare who like St. Francis desired to leave all for Christ. Following St. Clare many Christian woman were inspired to live a monastic life in poverty, chastity, and obedience. St. Francis by leaving all for Christ became a source of inspiration and motivation for countless Saints, missionaries, man, and woman from all walks of life. This is what a love of Christ can do with the world, it can truly transform it. However, to cultivate the true love of Christ, as both these saints would attest, is required the contemplation and love of the cross. It is the cross of Christ that gives us the strength and courage necessary to let go of things that hold us back from embracing the love of Christ with our whole heart. St. Francis spend long hours in contemplation of the cross and drew the strength from his prayer to practice the charity for the poor. During one of those moments of contemplation St. Francis received stigmatas, that is a visible wounds of Christ on his own body, so that he could even more fully share in the sufferings of Christ and in result in greater love of Christ. Even though St. Francis saw in created world the love and goodness of God, yet he sought to love not the creation, but the Creator. Today people attribute to St. Francis wrongful depiction of his life, that he was about love of creation and animals. In truth St. Francis was about love of Christ and his cross and for this reason he must be an example and inspiration for every Catholic that seek to love and follow Christ like him. St. Francis was not an activist about saving animals, environment, or the planet. Unfortunately, in the confused world that we live even the saints can be used to further personal agendas instead of helping us to live a more authentic Catholic Faith and a more authentic love of Christ.
