



<u>H</u>ere's <u>One Positive Encouragement</u>

Why do we love? Why do we love our spouse, children, parents, other family members, our friends? Do you love them because society and our church say that they should be loved by you or because you have a close relationship and understanding of each other which leads to sharing empathy which can be described as love? Now the big question, do you love Jesus? You are probably saying yes, but how could you truly love Him if you do not have a close relationship and understanding with Him. Jesus, being God has empathy (defined: the ability to understand and share the feelings of another which we call love). Jesus loves us unconditionally. What are we doing to develop a close relationship with him, to truly be close and truly loving of him? If we truly want a loving relationship with Jesus, we must talk to him. Here are three suggestions: (1) Keep it simple, try asking: Jesus what should I do about... Jesus what do you think about... Jesus would you... Jesus why did this... (2) Keep it real, talk to Jesus about a concern of yours that you have right now tell him I'm struggling with... I need help with... I do not understand why... I am frustrated because... (3) Keep it sincere, some things to talk about: I am hoping for ... I am excited because ... I am thankful for... today I noticed.... HOPEFULLY you can talk to Jesus many times during the day, establishing a relationship with him (which is really praying) and allowing him time to answer your prayers. How will you know your prayers are being answered? Your thoughts will tell you; you just need to accept Jesus loving answers whether you like them or not. It is HOPED that you remember that what you asked for may not be in Jesus' plans for you. As a loving friend with empathy toward Jesus, can you accept his answers gratefully?
