## A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,

This week on October 15th we will celebrate the memorial of St. Teresa of Jesus also known at St. Teresa of Avila. She was a Spanish mystic and is a declared by the Church the Doctor of Prayer. St. Teresa was involved in the reform of Carmelite order, and she found Descaled Carmelites which live a more austere life of prayer and penance. St. Teresa desired to return to the original rule of the order of Carmel. She was inspired by the life of the prophet Elisha who encountered the Lord on the mount Carmel and was faithful in carrying out God's every wish. In the similar way she had a great devotion to St. John the Baptist who lived a simple life of prayer and penance. Although not everyone is called to the vocation of the religious life as a nun or a monk, yet we all can benefit from the wisdom and practical spiritual counsels that St. Teresa offers us.

All of us by the virtue of our Christian Baptism are called to the life of holiness and perfection. Remember how the Lord in the gospel speaks to us and commands us: "Be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect" The Lord did not call to the life of perfection only those living in religious orders, but his every follower, his every disciple. One cannot obtain holiness or perfection of life without a change of life and fervent life of prayer. Notice that a change of life is a first step that we must take to live a holy life, a life of perfection. We must take concrete steps in correcting our daily life, for the life of perfection is lived out through ordinary days of our life. We must change our habits that fill our daily activities. This involves setting our minds on the goal of our life which is the union with God. We cannot have a union with God if our life is not put in order so that there is a harmony in our daily life with the will of God. This requires discipline of mind and heart. We need to constantly remind ourselves and be aware that our daily activities serve as means by which we carry out God's will and grow in virtue. It won't be easy in the beginning, because forming good habits that will enable us to grow in virtue takes time and patience.

We may not be able to control what surprises life brings, but we definitely decide how we can respond to them. Building virtue takes time because it requires of us to make consistently the right decision even if the circumstances change. Each time we succeed in making the right decision, we grow stronger in our mind and heart to make the same choice the next time. Over time our mind and heart will be shaped so that the decision of our mind and heart becomes natural to us. Our will become more disposed to choose the right thing and less tempted to choose what is wrong. Vigilance however must always be present in our mind since it is easily to fall away from the path of virtue and begin to walk in our old habits or return to our old vices. That is why our spiritual life as St. Teresa instructs us is a constant journey and endless effort until we leave this life and are finally united with our God in the glory of heaven. St. Teresa also gives us encouraging thought that as we become more closely united with God in this life, that our work begins to be done with a greater ease and effortlessly, since the life of divine grace will be aiding us in the process to complete the task.

The holiness of Christian life has as its goal the complete union with God. For a Christian to move into a deeper union with God, he must enter through a stage of purification. This stage of moving toward union with God requires of us first, to remove mortal sins from our life. There is no possibility to have a union with God if one is spiritually dead because of mortal sin. Also, the life of virtue will not be possible to attain due to this major obstacle. Once we reform our life so that mortal sins are not part of our Christian living, then we must move on to the removal of venial sins.

St. Teresa compares the venial sins to a nasty, crawling beasts that want to stifle our progress and prevent us from moving closer into union with God. Those venial sins seemingly small must be removed so that our soul is fit for the dwelling of God. It will also allow the divine life to flow into our soul, so the soul may be drawn in to the deeper union with God. The soul needs to be purified from all the attachments of this life, and this is accomplished through suffering and penance or in other word self-mortification. The mortification of the body and the will allows for the soul to take charge and not to be controlled by bodily passions, which oppose the soul in its desire for the union with God. The bodily passions seek comfort and pleasure and produce greater self-love, which stands in the way of the love of God. Once the soul is purified from all the attachments of this life, then it will be the love of God that will pull the soul deeper into union with Him.

Since we are to be in a complete union with God in heaven, then this task of purification from sin and growing in virtue must be taken to heart in this life otherwise we will be forced by the justice of God to complete it in purgatory, which won't be fun time. In all this process of preparation for the union with God our life of prayer needs to be also well practiced and that requires knowledge how to pray. St. Teresa speaks to us that prayer is like a conversation with a friend, but in this instance, it is the Lord to whom we speak. Therefore, our prayer, or conversation with the Lord needs to be appropriate in the manner and choice of words so as not to offend the One with whom we speak. St. Teresa also like other saints emphasized the need for regular participation in the sacrament of reconciliation as a mean to advance in spiritual journey toward union with God.

St. Teresa of Jesus, pray for us!

## Our Lady of Hope Parish

#### Dear Parishioners:

I am pleased to report this week on the financial results for our parish for the 2023/2024 fiscal year [July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024] and the budget for the 2024/2025 fiscal year. Our goal each year is to be transparent about our parish's financial activity, which includes Saint Jerome and Saint Mary Churches and Saint Jerome School. This summary has been reviewed and approved by the parish's Finance Council. Our financial results have remained positive, as reflected in the attached Financial Summary. I thank all of you for your support that enabled us to achieve these results.

Our operating income in 2023-2024 declined by \$36,000 from the budget we reported last year to \$17,300, and we project a decrease in 2024-2025 to \$14,000.

The- primary reasons for the decline from budget were a disappointing \$37,000 decrease in weekly collections, higher security fees and lease costs of \$51,000 and an increase of \$21,000 in school salaries and benefits. These factors were partially offset by a net increase of \$35,000 in Pre-k and After School income and a delay in the installation of the electronic sign at St Jerome.

Our operating income in 2024/2025 is projected to decrease slightly to \$14,000. The key assumptions in the 2024/2025 budget include:

- a—an increase in K-8 enrollment to 210 students and a decrease in the PreK program to 38 children
- b—an assumption that weekly collections will be in line with the 2023/2024 level
- c--- decreases in school salaries and benefits of \$16,000 and security fees and lease costs of \$15,000
- d—an increase of \$39,000 in utility, maintenance and insurance costs
- Capital projects—

We have segregated various capital projects and their funding sources in the summary to highlight them. In 2023/2024 we completed the new Saint Jerome Church roof project and began work on exterior of the Saint Mary rectory that was not in the original budget but was funded by reserves. We also utilized donations to outfit a new modular classroom. For 2024/2025, we hope to install the electronic sign, finish the Saint Mary rectory project and received a donation for new textbooks.

We welcome any comments or questions you may have on the financial summary.

Thank you again for your support. Please help us increase the weekly collections, which are vital for the health of our parish.
