
## A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

Since my arrival in May you have seen me offer the Mass many times and I would guess by now a question might have crossed your mind. Why Father Marcin lowers the host so slow? Before we can answer this question there are a few thoughts that we need to consider. First, we need to understand what the purpose of the Mass or purpose of our Catholic worship is, the liturgy. There are two ends or goals, according to our Catholic believe, towards which the liturgy of the Mass is directed. The first and primary purpose is the worship of God. God is the object and subject of every liturgy, worship, or prayer. It is God that we are called to encounter, to adore, to give thanks. The worship of God is the greatest act of justice. We have been created for worship of our Creator, the one who is the source of our existence, our life. Every time God is being worshiped, He receives from us that which is expected from us anyway. Therefore, we can simply state that Mass is about God, not about us. The second purpose of the Mass is the sanctification of people. We, as God's creation, do not possess the holiness of our life from ourselves. We need to be sanctified or made holy by the One who already is Holy. The sanctification that we receive from God enables us to love and serve God more faithfully. The sanctification transforms us more and more into the image and likeness of our Creator and strengthens our relationship with Him. Since we desire to offer to God what is best and pleasing to Him, therefore we need help from Him. God sanctifies us to make us fit for worship. The first step in the process of sanctification, that we all took, was the sacrament of Baptism. However, because our will is weak and our intellect darkened, we continue to sin. The process of our sanctification is ongoing until at last we reach heaven. Therefore, we are in constant need of God's grace and mercy to be forgiven and sanctified anew. Another thought that we need to consider is that the Catholic liturgy is not something that we create as we see fit, nor it depends on the creative ability of the priest or parish. The Catholic liturgy is a gift from the Church to be done with the intent and purpose that the Church proposes to us. It is not our own creation that varies based upon culture or people. The liturgy is a divine act that unfolds before us and draws us into a deeper encounter with the mysteries of God. The liturgy allows us to enter and participate into the reality that is more real, that is more true. The priest offering the Mass and people joined with his offering are called to a greater reverence, respect, and awe, while the liturgy takes place. Since God comes into our midst, we cannot take His presence for granted. Instead, we fall on our knees in adoration with love and faith. We come to Mass to give adoration and thanks to God for His mercy, goodness, and salvation. We do not come to get something out of Mass, to make ourselves feel good or to be entertained. We come that we may participate in Jesus' offering of himself on the cross to the Father. We do not come to Mass to remember what Jesus did at last supper, but we enter into the events of our salvation, Jesus' passion and death, resurrection, and ascension. These events that are present for us now and are not seen as the events that happened in the past.

Jesus' offering of his life on the cross is present to us during the Mass. This is evident in the vivid way during the most sacred part of the Mass when bread and wine are being consecrated. When the priest pronounces the words of Christ the bread becomes really and truly body of Jesus and wine becomes really and truly His blood. During this sacred time, when host and later chalice is raised for the people to see and adore, Jesus is offering himself on the cross. Therefore, the actions of the priest should convey that by the way the host and chalice are being moved. Jesus spent at least three hours in agony on the cross, while for us it is only an extra minute of adoration. The slow lowering of the host should invoke in us the thought of Jesus being taken down from the cross and placed in the arms of his sorrowful mother. The slow lowering of the chalice should invoke in us the thought of Jesus precious blood slowly flowing out of his sacred wounds for our salvation, to wash away our sins. While Mary and saints join us during the offering of the sacrifice of the Mass, especially during the time of consecration, the heavens are in adoration of Christ in his passion. The angels that surround our altar kneel in adoration and bow their heads at this great act of love. When we recognize God present before us, our humility calls us to offer an extra care in handling of the gifts given to us by God. Since these gifts contain God himself, can we treat it just as if we would a piece of bread? By no means. We must treat it as the reality they contain demands. Our Lady of Hope, Pray for us!
