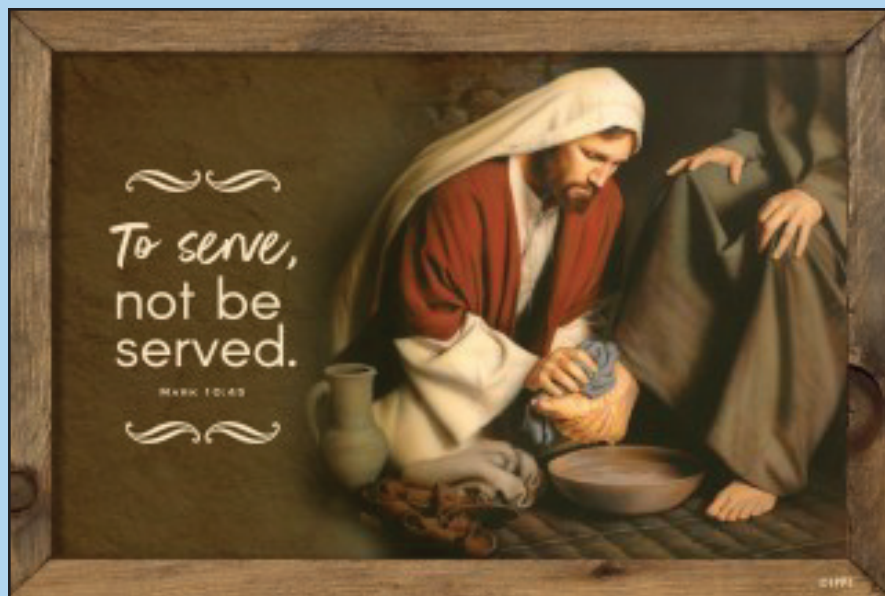

A Letter from Father Sheldon

My dear Sisters and brothers,

Peace be with you!

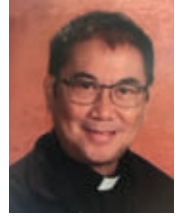
Are you familiar with the following lyrics?

Oh Dear Lord three things I pray.

To see thee more clearly

Love thee more dearly

Follow thee more nearly (Stephen Schwartz)



The title of the Song is "Day by Day". That song became one of my favorite songs when I was in college seminary. Very often we sang this to start our morning praise. I first heard this song in the movie "Godspell". I loved this song thinking that this is a folk rock ballad and we sang it as a prayer in a church setting. Nice. Every morning we sang this somehow woke me up especially when just fifteen minutes earlier I was still in dreamland. Slowly into the middle of the song, all my senses start to be alive and enthusiastic. Then I think what my day is about.... "...follow thee more nearly, Lord."

We would think that the disciples of Jesus followed Him nearly. But somehow not all of them saw what was still needed: A heart ready to serve the least among their brothers and sisters. They still needed to empty themselves of their ego and ambitions for worldly greatness. Obviously, there was competition among the disciples. Two of them wanted to make sure they sit at the right or the left of the Lord in His heavenly throne. Others were envious with the plan. Apparently, they also had their own selfish agenda.

Jesus took the opportunity to teach them about greatness and importance in the eyes of God. They must drink "the cup that I drink." His cup is the cup of suffering for the salvation of the world. As disciples, to drink His cup means we must strive to serve "and not to be served", offer our lives "as a ransom for many".

When we come to Mass, we have the privilege of "drinking His cup", to be in communion with Him. So that "Day by day, we see Him clearly, Love Him more dearly and follow Him more nearly".

Don't forget to pray the Rosary!

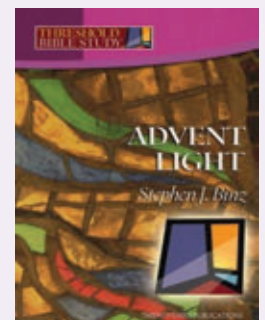

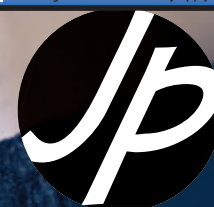
