A Letter from Father Marcin

Dear Parish Family,


This Sunday is the World Mission Sunday celebrated throughout the entire Church. Christ himself was sent by his Father for the mission of rescuing man from his sin and everlasting death and to restore man back to the life through divine grace. When Christ's mission on earth was ending, He entrusted the continuation of His mission to the apostles, to His Church with the great mandate: "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you and behold I am with you always until the end of the age." That is why the missionary work of the Catholic Church is simply the continuation of the work of Christ. Apostles went out to preach the good news of Jesus once they have received the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost. Each apostle went to a different region of the known world in the time of the first century. After the last of the apostles died, the work of bringing gospel of Christ to the people continued, primarily through the work of monks, priests, bishops. Their missionary work, however, does not discount the work of many lay Christian faithful who were very involved in bringing the pagan members of the world to the conversion to Christ. Many Christian faithful at the risk of their own life sought to bring people to the one true faith, one true religion. The Christians were very aware of their own responsibility to care not just for their own salvation, but also of those others who did not yet participate in the life of Christ. Since Christ came to offer his life on the cross for the salvation of all peoples, the Christian's duty and mission is to make this truth known to others who have not yet received or heard about it. Each Catholic Christian today by the virtue of baptism and as a disciple of our Savior Jesus Christ is called to this duty and mission. We have received the truth of Christ, and we are called to pass on this truth to others. Each Christian is called to love others, by making the gospel of Christ known to all. With the same sense of duty, and loving concern the Jesuits and oblates missionaries came to the continent of America to bring the truth of Christ and the grace of holy baptism to the native people of these lands in 17th century. Jesuit and oblates missionaries came with a burning love and desire to bring peace and truth of Jesus Christ to the native Indians so that they could have share in the salvation that was obtain for them at such a great price. These missionaries came not to obtain any material benefit for themselves, but rather for the benefit of those natives of these lands, for the salvation of their souls. These missionaries knew the risk and the cost of their efforts. They knew that they may face torture and that they are risking their lives, yet their desire of heart was prepared to face anything. They knew that Christ suffered and died for them and therefore they were imitating Christ and his love. Of the many missionaries that came to the continent of America the eight of them were martyred. We remember those eight as North American Martyrs. Their names are as followed: Jesuits St. Isaac Jogues martyred on October 18th, 1646, near Albany, NY, St. John de Brebeuf martyred on 16th of March 1649 near Georgian Bay, others St. Anthony Daniel, St. Gabriel Lalemant, St. Charles Garnier, St. Noel Chabanel, and two oblates St. Rene Goupil and St. Jean de la Lande. While serving in St. Gregory the Great parish in Hamilton, one of the parishioners shared with me about the shrine of North American Martyrs in New York State. I had never heard about this place. I decided to visit the shrine as part of the trip to learn more about American history. I was not paying attention to the dates of the trip, but I happen to visit the shrine just on the day that the North American Martyrs are being honored in the Catholic Church on October 19th. It was truly a remarkable opportunity to be at the place that St. Isaac Jogues was martyred, a sacred place sanctified by the blood of faithful disciple of Christ. If you would ever be interested to visit this special place you can search on the internet for the Shrine of North American Martyrs to have precise location and enjoy the trip, I can't wait for another opportunity to visit again. North American Martyrs St. Isaac Jogues and companions, Pray for us! Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, Pray for us! Our Lady Star of Evangelization, Pray for us!

Please register as a parishioner

Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think they automatically are registered just by attending Mass regularly in a particular parish but it requires a form to be submitted to the parish office with copies of sacrament records. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes such as, scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility form if requirements are met, a qualification letter from the pastor and receiving a year end donation tax statement. Weekly collection envelopes are used to track attendance at Mass. Registration in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
