

Follow up to Huh? (Remember last week?)

Q: How can Sacred Scripture be "truth" if not everything in it is right?

A: The Bible is not meant to convey precise historical information or scientific findings to us. Moreover, the authors were children of their time. Their forms of expression are influenced by the sometimes inadequate cultural images of the world around them. Nevertheless, everything that man must know about God and the way of his salvation is found with infallible certainty in Sacred Scripture. (CCC 107-109)

Father PJ's Letter

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace and Joy to you and your loved ones!

Here is a different version of the parable Jesus shared this weekend about those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else.



Two women went to church one day. The first one, dressed in a tight fitting clothes, was on her way to the gym. She prayed, "Jesus, I thank you that I am not like the other women here around me—lazy, unhealthy, poor homemakers. I thank you that I am not even like this fat woman in front of me. I wonder what she feeds her family. I watch carefully what I eat and I only give my family what is healthy. Thank you for making

me strong and fit as a fiddle. I might even live to be a hundred."

The second one, who was slightly overweight, could not even look up. She bowed her head and prayed, "Jesus, thank you for giving me and my family what we basically need. We do not deserve it.

I am sure that there may be other variations to this parable, but we get the message. We can never be proud before God. He sees through our hearts, our prayers and our desires. We only need to bow humbly before him, along with our own faults and weaknesses.

God's grace is sufficient for those who humble themselves, for power is perfected in weakness.




PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS
