A Letter from Father Marcín

Dear Parish Family,

During the month of October dedicated to Our Blessed Mother, we turn our attention to her who is our help and protection. I cannot help but recall the great event called the miracle of the sun that took place on October 13th 1917th in Portugal. This event took place at a moment when Europe was still engulfed in the First World War, which ultimately ended in 1918. During this turbulent time when forces of evil were spreading in various forms and peace of the world was greatly desired. Our Blessed Mother under the title the Queen of Peace provided a proof of her apparitions to the little children of Fatima, so that there would be no doubt among the people that the children truly saw her. No one else but the children could see her figure. Mary provided to thousands of people who gathered on that day, both believers and unbelievers this great sign. Those who witnessed the miracle recounted how the dense rain clouds suddenly dispersed, revealing the sun. The sun that was visible to the people's eyes began to move rapidly across the sky and spinning and producing brilliance of light in multiple colors. As people were mesmerized by the sun's beauty suddenly saw the sun beginning to move towards them as if the sun was to fall on the people. People recalled that some in the crowds were crying out in fear, while others were calling for God's mercy. Then suddenly again the sun returned to its proper place in the sky glowing with normal light. The people who stood in drenching rain realized that the ground and their clothing were completely dry. This event was even reported by journalists from the US and other countries. Unfortunately, the photography of that time was not sophisticated enough to capture the miracle of the dancing sun itself. However, the brilliance of the sun during the event was seen much further than just in the place where people gathered. Now, you may wonder why this is relevant to us. It is because the event that God granted to happen was a sign that we are not alone in any time of human history. No matter how bad the things may get in the world, we must never loose hope that God is in control of time and history. Everything that exists or happens is under God' watchful care and those who place their hopes in Him will not be disappointed. While we witness in todays' world violence, war, and conflicts, we should recall those great miracles to remind ourselves that not all is lost and that there is always plenty of hope. The evil in the world unfortunately arises due to the condition of the human heart. We as free human beings hold the key to peace in the world. It is because when hatred is harbored in the human heart instead of love, mercy, forgiveness, and compassion that this hatred overflows into acts of hatred, retribution, and violence. That is why the sin is so hated by God, because it destroys all good that God created. God created all things out of love, but the sin undermines the good and contributes to the growth of evil. We should therefore not be surprised that God desires to bring the end to sin and its destructive effects. That is why rooting out the sin from our lives should be our concern in promoting love, goodness, and peace. Also, fervent prayers offered daily for the conversion of sinners should be our desire as well. Our Blessed Mother made a request in Fatima to pray for peace in the world, but also for the conversion of sinners, because one depends on the other. Sin leads to war, while love and goodness leads to peace. God is all-powerful and He can make the sun move as He wills, therefore let us move our hearts to do His will and we will find peace. Our Lady of Fatima, Pray for us! Our Lady Queen of Peace, Pray for us sinners! Our Lady of Hope, we place our hope in you!

Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think they automatically are registered just by attending Mass regularly in a particular parish but it requires a form to be submitted to the parish office with copies of sacrament records. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes such as, scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility form if requirements are met, a qualification letter from the pastor and receiving a year end donation tax statement. Weekly collection envelopes are used to track attendance at Mass. Registration in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
