## A Letter from Father Marcin

### Dear Parish Family,

On October 7th we celebrate the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. This memorial was established by Pope Pius the V after the successful defeat of Ottoman Empire fleet by Catholic Western States. This victory on the Mediterranean Sea on October 7th, 1571, was attributed to the intercession of Our Blessed Mother. The battle was raging on the sea between Western vessels who were outnumbered by the Ottoman Empire Fleet. While the sailors were engaged in battle the monks on those vessels were engaged in the prayer of the rosary. The Ottoman Empire fleet was defeated by much fewer vessels of the Catholic League. When the news of the victory has reached Rome, the pope decided to mark this day as a day of thanksgiving to Our Blessed Mother under the title of Our Lady of Victory for granting the Catholic Nations of Europe the protection from the forces of Islamic nation. The name of this memorial was later changed to Our Lady of the Rosary to emphasize even more the power of the holy rosary. The rosary is a particular devotion that was frequently asked by Our Blessed Mother during her gracious visits from heaven in various apparitions. The Church too through out many centuries encouraged this form of prayer, particularly suited to the Christian life, which can be very busy and full of demands. The rosary is a meditative prayer, because we meditate or reflect on the parts of Christ life. Meditation on Christ's life is of great benefit for every Christian. Christ set an example for us to follow and therefore our imitation of Christ will help us to confirm our lives more and more to that of His. Every Christian should desire in his heart to be more Christlike in every aspect of life. Therefore, the rosary provides an excellent opportunity to draw closer to Christ and in no way does it takes away any honor and glory that is due to Him. Christ is in the center of this prayer and devotion. The prayers that are being raised to Our Blessed Mother asking for her intercession help us to focus on the mystery of Incarnation. They also remind us of our sinfulness and the need to persevere in the Faith until the end of our life. The rosary teaches us to entrust ourselves to Mary and rely on her help to lead us to her Divine Son. Mary is perfectly confirmed to the holy will of God, of her Son and she would never ask us to do anything that would in even the slightest way pulled us away from Christ. Therefore, we should have full confidence and trust, that this prayer will be to our benefit. Those who pray the rosary faithfully and regularly receive unique help and protection from Our Blessed Mother, because we show our love and dedication to her who loves us so dearly. Also, praying the rosary can obtain for us many graces and favors that we need to obtain eternal life as well as the help for the needs of this life. Those individuals who struggle with habitual sins will be able to obtain the grace to break the habit and grow in virtue that is opposite to that particular sin. The praying of the rosary will obtain the grace of purity of life and will obtain us the grace to remain steadfast in resisting the sins of the flesh. Those who struggle with pornography and impure acts will be able to break away from those habits and will be able to experience a healing of soul, mind, and body. Today many men, women and young people struggle with sins of impurity, which destroys their innocence and makes for them a great challenge to grow in spiritual life and even endangers their salvation. The rosary is such a powerful prayer that saints used in their own spiritual life because they understood its value. If the rosary is not yet part of your spiritual life, then now is the time to get on board. We must cling to Our Mother during these difficult times. We must chain ourselves to Mary, for we must know that no one who stays close to her will go astray or lose his soul. She will help us to stay on the right path, and she will always lead us to her Divine Son. Let us honor Our Blessed Mother always, because we can never honor her more than she already is honored by God in heaven. Let us sincerely love Mary as our mother, because she is always by our side and deeply cares for us and loves us. Let us pray the holy rosary daily with love and faith, we won't regret the time spent because the rosary is a heavenly weapon that we use to conquer our greatest enemies the devil, the sin and all those

who are set against our one true faith. Let us not fear nor despair because through the prayer of the holy rosary our Blessed Mother will once again make us victorious in battle.
