

# A Letter from Father Marcin

### Dear Parish Family,

The Summer months have passed very quickly, and the Labor Weekend is upon us as another school year begins. Labor Day, that is celebrated Monday highlights the value of human work. Living our Catholic Faith demands from us a great deal of work, which is a work that is both natural and supernatural. For us Catholics work is not just limited to the human activity on natural level. We work within the boundaries of our limited human nature, but because of grace that we receive from God we have the opportunity to use our daily work as a means of our sanctification. Work done apart from God's grace has only temporal benefit, while doing work in the state of sanctifying grace has eternal benefits. Every morning as we rise to a new day of life, we must keep in mind that the tasks and responsibilities that we are going to engage in will be for us a source of blessing and the opportunity to grow in grace. Therefore, upon our rising from the bed we should dedicate a moment to pray to our Lord in thanksgiving for another day that we are being blessed with. We should offer and dedicate the day and all our works to our God for His glory. Knowing that on our own we are unable to do anything that is truly pleasing to God, we should ask the Lord for the grace that we may do all our work well, with holy intention and that He may bring it to completion in accordance with his holy will. Throughout the day we should continue to offer our supplications to God for the help of his grace before we start some particular action or work, and after its completion offer a thanks to God for his assistance in the work completed. This ongoing supplication and thanksgiving will keep our mind and heart aware of God's presence in our daily life and every activity. We will experience and learn to walk our daily life humbly with the Lord and at the same time it will help us to grow in faith. This practice will provide us with the means to strengthen our trust in God and place greater dependence on Him. Every Catholic is called to be holy, to live saintly life, to become a saint. Saints walked their human lives as we do with various activities and responsibilities. What distinguished them was their use of work as an opportunity to train in virtue, as proves of their faith and love of God. There are many activities or work that we do, which is not known or seen by others, however nothing is hidden from God's gaze as He looks upon the Earth from his celestial throne. The word of God reminds us that "God does not judge by appearances but looks into the heart". Although, we engage in many external activities, the full reality of how they are being done is known to God. We may do some good work, but if our intention, or the way we do it, or its end is not good but evil or sinful, then the entire action or work becomes evil or sinful. Therefore, the offering and dedication of our work to God keeps us aware of this reality, that we are imperfect and insufficient in ourselves, but God who is perfect and all-powerful can help us in our work so that it will become authentically good. Living our Catholic Faith and growing in holiness is intertwine with prayer and work, as Benedictine charism states "Ora et Labora". Not all Catholics are called to live as monks, yet all Catholics are called to live their lives engaged in prayer and in good works. That is why every daily activity that we do can be for us a means to pray, to do good works and to result in our sanctification. Prayer will unite us to God and the grace that we will obtain from it will become evident in our daily work. St. James the apostle says, "Faith without works is dead". Pope, St. Gregory the Great whose memorial falls on this Sunday was aware of this truth. During his papacy he removed many clerics from the ministry, who were lazy and unwilling to engage in good works. St. Gregory had no tolerance for such evil behavior. Those lazy clerics were causing scandal to the faithful in not providing good example of the Catholic Faith and could have been the cause of the lost of salvation to those who imitated them. Therefore, let us live our Catholic Faith with Faith in our hearts, with prayer on our minds and lips and with good works in our daily lives. St. Benedict, Pray for us! St. Gregory the Great, Pray for us! Our Lady of Hope, Pray for us!


