

CHOOSING A SPONSOR

Candidates for baptism and confirmation need a sponsor. The sponsor is a Catholic guide who, knowing the ways of faith, helps the person who is receiving the sacrament to begin living the faith in the Catholic Church more fully, in keeping with the graces the sacrament supplies.

The sponsor must be a person who can share the **good example of their life as a Catholic with me**. Their support and encouragement is what will help me to live a moral life which will prepare me for eternal life.

There are certain qualifications that the Church has for sponsors. Consider the following question before choosing a sponsor who has to be eligible according to the Church:

If I have to answer "NO" to any one of questions 1 through 6 that person cannot be a sponsor according to Church rules. Do not ask him/her.
